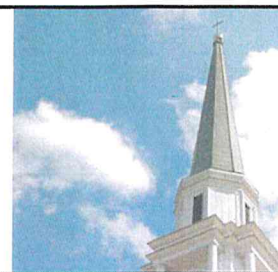

There is an old Russian saying, when someone misbehaves: “he acts like he doesn’t have a cross.” Every Orthodox Church has not just one but many crosses on its domes and towers, proclaiming the triumph of the cross and scattering the demons. The mystery of the Cross and Resurrection of Christ is what real Christianity is all about. It is precisely through the cross that we find Christ. It is impossible to follow Christ without carrying the cross.

As soldiers of Christ, we are called to combat the confusion and error by following ever more intently and wholeheartedly the Way of the Cross. The Cross is the sole reason for the Incarnation, for the Coming of God the Son in our human nature. Our Lord Jesus Christ was incarnate in the womb of the ever-Virgin Mary for one only reason, so that He might suffer and die for us on the Cross and so win for us the gift of everlasting life by His Resurrection. In His instruction to Nicodemus, during His public ministry, our Lord Jesus made it clear that He must die on the Cross in order that we might have eternal life. He told Nicodemus: "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life... For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (Jn 3, 14-21).

The crucifix is the sign of our salvation through the immeasurable love of God for us. It was that God inspired Saint Francis of Assisi to pray, upon entering a church: *"We adore you, Lord Jesus Christ, here and in all your churches in the whole world, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world."* The crucifix is the great sign of our hope that we who die with Christ in baptism will also rise to everlasting life with Him.

As we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, let us thank God for the gift of His very life which is ours in the Church. Let us rededicate ourselves to dwell always in the Heart of God through His only-begotten Son, our Savior. Let us embrace once again the Cross of the Savior in which alone we find our salvation.

Thank you for your prayers and contributions. May Blessed Mother Mary protect you all from all sickness and dangers.

Stewardship Reflection... The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son."* John 3:16. God created us to be in relationship with Him. Sin broke that relationship. Jesus came to earth so that we may reconcile our relationship with God. Following Jesus' example, we can be blessed with a joy-filled life on earth and eternal life in Heaven. These four points are known as the "kerygma" – the first proclamation of the Gospel. Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross

Num 21:4b-9 | Phil 2:6-11 | Jn 3:13-17

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Although God had freed our ancestors in faith from their slavery in Egypt, today we find them grumbling against the Lord as they wander in the desert. Even after we've glimpsed so much of God's goodness, we, too, can begin to grumble in challenging moments of our lives. It's precisely then that we need to cling to faith. After serpents appeared and began to bite those who had grumbled against God, those who had been bitten only had to look at the serpent mounted on a pole and put their faith in God once again to be healed. Similarly, when we find ourselves in the trials of life, we need only look at the cross of Jesus with faith. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." Amid the storms of our lives, we are called to put our trust in his cross, for through it we are saved and set free.

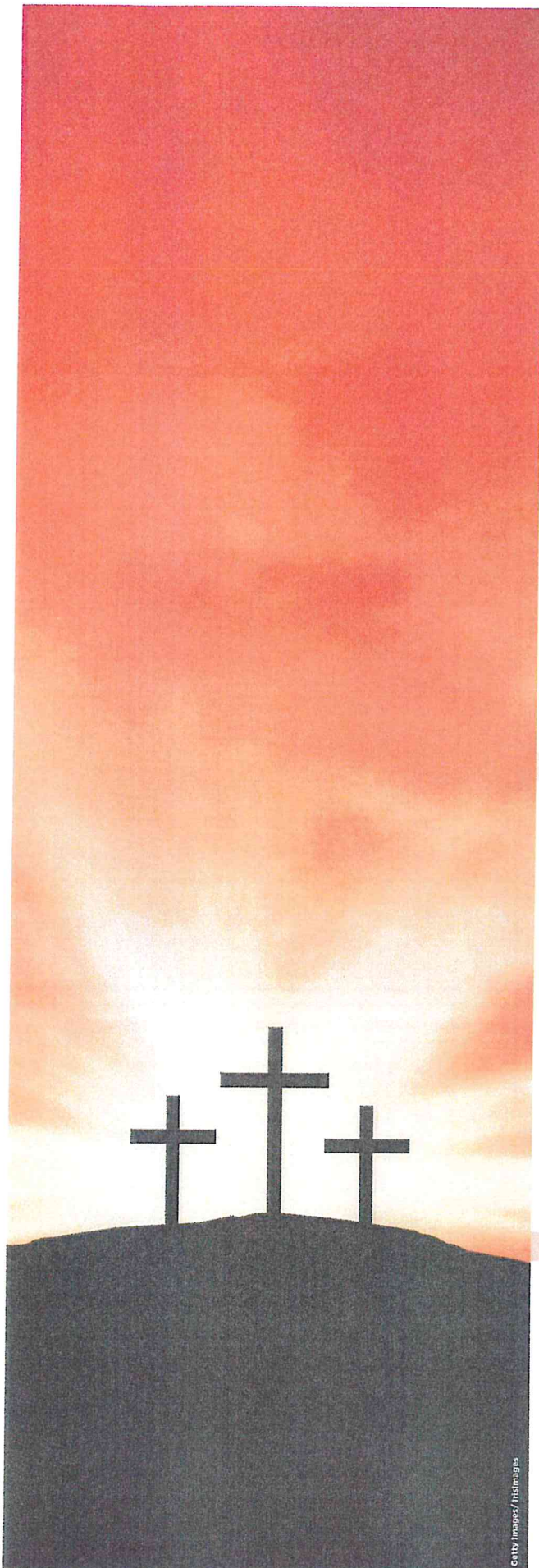
GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Paul tells us that God the Father "greatly exalted" Jesus for his humility in embracing the cross, and that ultimately, all creation will join the Father in glorifying Christ. We who know the gift of what Jesus did for us on the cross are called to praise him with our voices and our lives. We praise and glorify Christ first through our example. How might our day-to-day interactions give others a glimpse of the humble and self-emptying love of Jesus? Finally, think of the ways that knowing Christ's love has made a difference in your life. Has it made you more patient? Has it made you more hopeful? Think of ways that you could share this in conversation. Telling others about what God has done for you or the difference that he has made in your life is one way of exalting Christ.

PRAISE

Today, spend some time thanking and praising God for the gift of the cross and our salvation in Christ. You might wish to use this traditional prayer frequently used during the stations of the cross in Lent: "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you. Because, by your holy cross, you have redeemed the world."

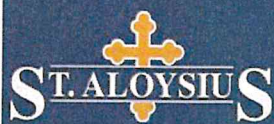
