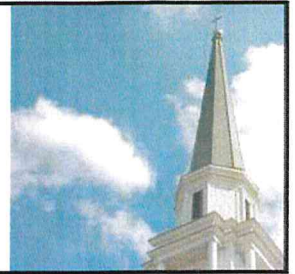

March 8, 2026... Third Sunday of Lent



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

With hearts full of gratitude, I thank you for your presence, prayers, and participation in our recent Lenten Parish Mission. Your openness to God's Word, your willingness to reflect deeply, and your spirit of fellowship made these days a true blessing for our parish families. This mission was not just an event, it was a shared journey of faith, renewal, and preparation for the joy of Easter. Your generosity of time, talent, and hospitality, from welcoming guests to lifting voices in prayer, reflected the love of

Christ in a beautiful way. It was a time to think differently about our faith and prayer. May the seeds planted during this mission continue to grow in our hearts, drawing us ever closer to the Lord during this holy season of Lent and beyond. Be assured of my prayers for you and your loved ones.

We are assembled here in the Church to drink the water of eternal life and salvation. Washed in it at Baptism, renewed by its abundance at each Eucharist, invited to it in every proclamation of the Word, and daily empowered by the anointing of the Holy Spirit, we are challenged by today's Gospel to remain thirsty for the living water, which only Jesus can give.

The first reading describes how God provided water to the ungrateful complainers of Israel, God reminds us that our hard hearts need to be softened by Him through our grace-prompted, grace-assisted prayer, fasting and works of mercy which enable us to receive the living water of the Holy Spirit, salvation, and eternal life from the Rock of our salvation. In the Gospel, an unclean, Samaritan woman is given an opportunity to receive the living water. Jesus awakened in the woman at the well a thirst for the wholeness and integrity which she had lost, a thirst which he had come to satisfy. So, we need the grace of Jesus Christ for eternal life because Jesus IS that life-giving water.

Brothers and sisters, we need to allow Jesus free entry into our personal lives. Jesus wishes to come into our "private" life, not to embarrass us, not to judge or condemn us, but to free us, to change us, and to offer us what we really need: *the living water of the Holy Spirit*. Let us find this *living water* in the Sacraments, in prayer, and in the Holy Bible, especially during this Lenten season. We need to be witnesses to Jesus as the Samaritan woman was. Let us have the courage to "be" Jesus for others, especially in those "unexpected" places for "unwanted" people. Let us also have the courage of our Christian convictions to stand for truth and justice in our day-to-day life.

Today's Gospel message challenges us to get rid of our unholy attachments and the evil habits and sinful addictions that keep us enslaved and idolatrous. Lent is our time to learn from our mistakes of over-indulgence in food, drink, drugs, gambling, promiscuity, or any other addiction that distances us from Jesus our savior.

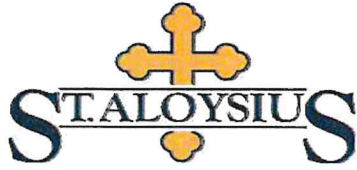

Parish Bulletin Board

We have begun our **forty day journey** through the sacred desert of Lent. Lenten Regulations 1. Abstinence - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. 2. Fast - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed. (Persons with health concerns may adjust within the spirit of the fast). 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Please note... Friday, March 13 daily Mass will be 8:20am (Grandparents Day Mass). Adoration/Benediction will be from 7:00am - 3:00pm. There will be no Stations of the Cross and 6:00pm evening Mass.

Reconciliation during Lent... As a reminder, confession is every Saturday from 3:30 - 4:00pm. Our area penance service is being hosted at St. Cabrini on Sunday, March 22 at 2:00pm.

The Diocesan collection for **Catholic Relief Services** will be next weekend (March 14-15). This collection brings Christ's love to victims and provides aid for people affected by war, natural disasters and exploitation here in the United States and abroad. There is an envelope in your March/April packet. Thank you for your generosity.

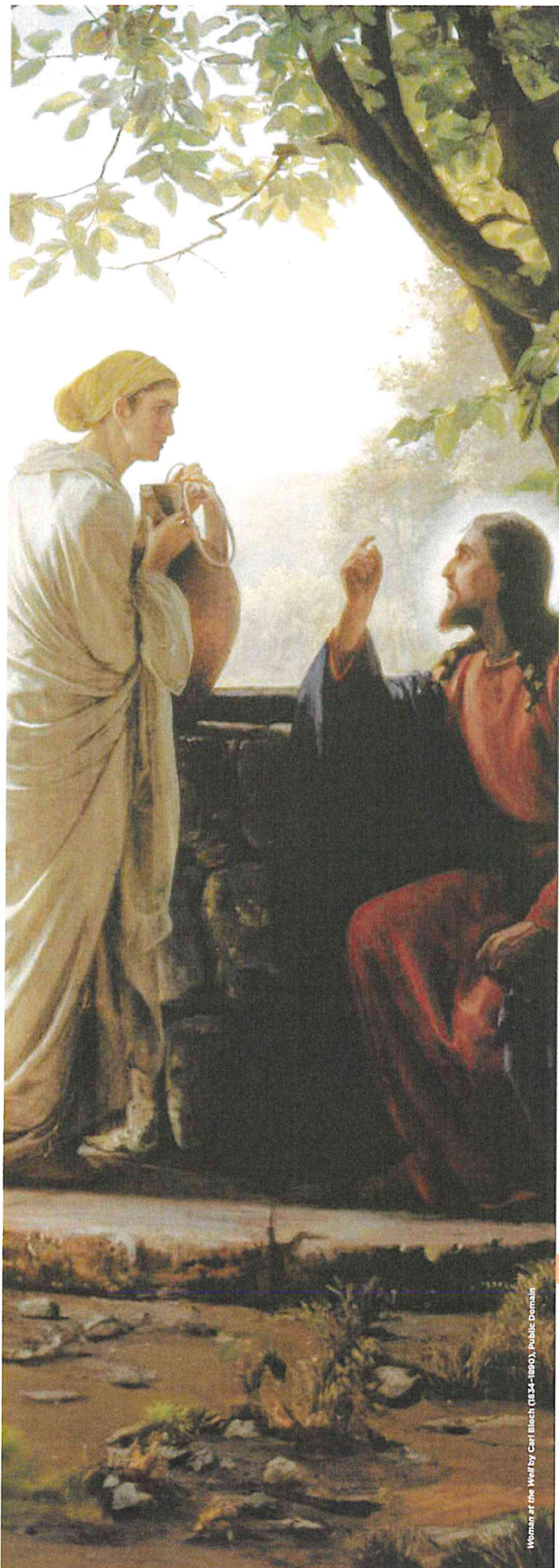

As the Israelites wandered in the desert, Moses heard their cries and recognized their deeper need, not simply for water, but for hope. And so Moses calls upon the Lord, who gives them water in the desert, revealing his trustworthiness. In the big and little ways that we ask the same question - "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" - our loving and generous Father reminds us that he has not abandoned us and that his goodness will ultimately prevail. It's easy to become disgruntled like the Israelites when there is great pain and suffering around us. But through the ways that we care for one another and the peace that we find in prayer, the Father reminds us that he stands with us, granting us sustenance and grace.


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

When Christ told the woman at the well that those who drink the water he gives will never thirst again, she thought he was offering literal water. Christ was instead revealing his own identity as the Son of God. This woman, who hears the words of Christ and knows God's promise of a Messiah, is filled with hope as she comes to recognize that the Lord indeed was in her midst. And I find it interesting that when she told people in town of her encounter with Christ, she told them of how he saw the mistakes of her past. Jesus loved her, and called her to step into the fullness of who she could be by turning away from the past that she clung to. We live in a world where we have very real physical needs, like the Israelites who thirsted, and the need to be seen in love, like the Samaritan woman. Ultimately, at the core of both of these needs is the desire for the hope that only God can give. When we serve our neighbors and look upon others with love, we can also be the vessel through which the presence of God is made known.

In our world, people are constantly asking the question, "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" Reflect on one way that you can share the Good News of the Gospel through word or action to make the presence of God known to those in your community.


