## March 22, 2026... Fifth Sunday of Lent



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ,

As we draw closer to Holy Week, the Church invites us to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's life-giving mission. The readings for this 5th Sunday of Lent (Year A) speak powerfully about **life, hope, and resurrection** themes that prepare our hearts for Paschal mystery.

In the Gospel (John 11:1–45), we encounter the moving story of the raising of Lazarus. Jesus stands before the tomb of His friend and proclaims: "I am the resurrection

and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live." This is not just a promise for the future—it is a reality that begins now for those who believe.

The first reading from Ezekiel (37:12–14) echoes this hope: God promises to open the graves of His people and put His Spirit within them so they may live. St. Paul, in the second reading (Romans 8:8–11), reminds us that the Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in us, giving life to our mortal bodies.

The raising of Lazarus is more than a miracle; it is a sign pointing to the ultimate victory of Christ over death. It reveals:

1. **Jesus' Deep Compassion** – He weeps with those who mourn, showing us that God is not distant from our pain.
2. **The Power of Faith** – Martha's confession, "Yes, Lord, I believe," becomes a model for our own trust in Christ.
3. **The Call to New Life** – Just as Lazarus was unbound from his burial cloths, we are called to be freed from the sins, fears, and doubts that keep us from living fully in God's grace.

As we approach the final movement of Lent:

- **Examine your heart:** What "tombs" in your life need the voice of Jesus to call you out?
- **Seek reconciliation:** The Sacrament of Confession is a powerful way to experience the Lord's mercy and new life.
- **Be a witness of hope:** In a world often marked by despair, live in such a way that others see the life of Christ in you.

The story of Lazarus reminds us that no situation is beyond God's reach. Even in the darkest moments, Christ stands before us and calls us by name: "Come out!" This Lent let us respond with faith, allowing His Spirit to breathe new life into our hearts.

Thank you for your unconditional sacrifices and support.

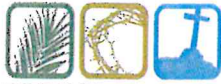

word **Triduum** means "three days." It celebrates the central mystery of our faith: the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Triduum begins on the evening of Holy Thursday and concludes on Easter Sunday. • Holy Thursday Mass at 7:00pm – Mass of the Lord's Supper (St. Aloysius). We remember the Last

Supper, the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood, and Jesus' command to serve others, symbolized by the washing of the feet. • Good Friday Service at 6:00pm – The Passion of the Lord. (St. Cabrini) The Church reflects on Jesus' suffering and death on the cross for our salvation. It is a solemn day of prayer, fasting, and veneration of the cross. • Holy Saturday and the Easter Vigil at 7:00pm (St. Aloysius) - The Church waits in hope at the tomb until the Easter Vigil, when we celebrate Christ's Resurrection, the victory of life over death, and welcome new members into the Church. These three days are celebrated as one great liturgy, inviting us to enter deeply into the mystery of Christ's love and the salvation he won for us. Sunday, April 5 Mass times are 7:00am(St. Aloysius) 9:30am(St. Cabrini) and 11:00am (St. Aloysius).

### **GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

The raising of Lazarus marks an irreversible turning point in Jesus' ministry. It's impossible to publicly raise someone from the dead and continue to fly beneath the radar. It's no surprise that the next time we meet Jesus, he'll be greeted with Hosannas and palm branches as the promised Son of David. But we also know that by raising Lazarus, Jesus attracts the attention of his enemies and sets himself on a course that ultimately leads to the cross. In our own life of discipleship, there may be times when we will have to step up and make a decisive and public choice for our faith or our values. Standing up for what's right may bring praise and admiration, or lead to misunderstanding or even persecution. We can draw strength in these decisive moments from the knowledge that the One we follow is the resurrection and the life. Any risk we take in following him is worth it in the end.

### **GO** EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's Gospel passage features the shortest and perhaps one of the most profound verses in all of Scripture: "And Jesus wept." This text reveals that before he restored his friend to life, we have a God who weeps with us over the losses and tragedies of our lives. Likewise, before we can announce the Good News of the Gospel, we must learn the "art of accompaniment," as Pope Francis reminded us in *Evangelii Gaudium*. (169) This requires that we offer "our closeness and our compassionate gaze" to all those we seek to evangelize. When our first action consists of compassion, empathy, and entering into the joys and sorrows of others, our efforts at evangelization will bear much fruit.

### **INVITATION**

St. Paul tells us to "Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep." (Rom 12:15) As we enter the final week of Lent and prepare for Holy Week, spend some time thinking about who in your life is experiencing a particular moment of joy or sorrow at this time. Consider one concrete action you can take to be present to them: it could be dropping off a meal to someone who recently had surgery, sitting with someone who lost a loved one and listening as they share stories of their lives together, or bringing a special treat to celebrate a friend's recent accomplishment. Then - do it.
