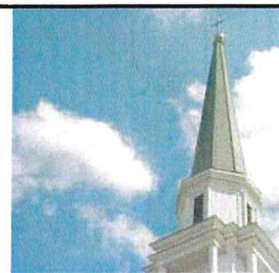

Dear sisters and brothers in Jesus Christ,

Today we thank our mothers, pray for them, honor them by celebrating Mother's Day and by offering our mothers on the altar of God during this Holy Eucharist. George Washington once said, "My mother was the most beautiful woman I ever saw. All I am I owe to my mother. I attribute all my success in life to the moral, intellectual, and physical education I received from her." Abraham Lincoln spoke similar words when he said, "All that I am or ever hope to be, I owe to my angel Mother." Unfortunately, many people in our society

would not agree with these great men who had great mothers.

Today, Motherhood is an extremely high calling. What relationship can ever replace the love of a mother? It is essential for mothers to realize that the love, guidance and influence they provide to their children are distinct.

There is no doubt that motherhood is an extremely high calling. But to whom can mothers look like the real model of motherhood? Today's modern culture offers many role models through television, movies, and women's magazines. However, often these role models are either all together wrong or they offer an extremely limited and unrealistic view of true motherhood. Added to all these sufferings, is the pain endured by many married women who would like to be mothers.

I am grateful for the hard work and dedication of the mothers in our parish. No matter where I have ever been as a seminarian or as a priest, I always experienced the love of the mothers. I have always seen the promise of Jesus fulfilled. Concretely, not only have many dedicated mothers assisted me in my ministry as your priest, I have also received many spiritual mothers and many spiritual sisters, many of whom have become life-long friends. Thank you to all.

On this beautiful day dedicated to motherhood, my prayer is that the Holy Spirit will renew the hearts of all mothers so that they can live out their calling to motherhood with a deeper and more generous love within the daily circumstances of their lives. The Holy Spirit will fill all women with the gift of love and that they may fully understand their true dignity as daughters of the God of love. May Jesus Bless you and I love all dear mothers.

Many find it helpful to use the "One Dollar per Week per \$1,000 of Annual Income" guideline. For example, a household with a \$50,000 annual income might consider a \$50 weekly commitment. Your pledge is a sacrificial gift above and beyond your regular offertory, and every commitment, no matter the size, makes a lasting impact. Thank you for your continued prayers, your generosity, and your commitment to St Aloysius. Together, we are building something that will bless not only our parish today, but for many years to come.

## Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 | 1 Pt 3:15-18 | Jn 14:15-21

### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Several years ago, while praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, I heard the words, "I just couldn't bear to leave you." It was one of the clearest responses to prayer that I have experienced, and it occurred at a time when I was feeling incredibly lonely. I have spent years reflecting on those words, which resurface often as I receive Christ in the Eucharist. In the Gospel today, I hear echoes of those words again as Christ explains to the Apostles the many ways in which they – and we – will not be abandoned after his ascension into heaven. As the rest of the Gospel unfolds, the events of his passion and resurrection reveal the Lord's faithfulness to them. After the resurrection, the Apostles know they can trust his word because they remember Jesus' promise that the Father will send an Advocate to be with them. We, also, can trust him believing that out of complete and utter love for humanity, Jesus remains with us.

### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The Apostles accompanied one another in their community of faith, and they walked with those who had recently responded to God's call to know the truth, as we see with the newly baptized in Samaria. In our lives today, the value of accompaniment cannot be underestimated. In our busy world when it is easy to feel disconnected and alone, being with one another is a powerful way to be a vessel through which Christ proclaims his promise to never leave us. By sitting with another in a time of grief, listening to the questions of a friend who is struggling, or rejoicing with a friend in response to good news, we accompany each other through life's ups and downs. Sometimes accompaniment consists of proclaiming the Good News of Christ's love and thereby helping others to have the courage to do the same. In whatever ways we are called to accompany another in their journey of faith, we do so with the promise that Christ is doing the same for us.

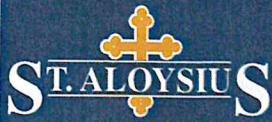
