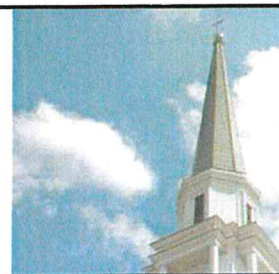

## May 17, 2026... Ascension of the Lord



My dear brothers and sisters in the Lord,

Today, Holy Mother Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Forty days after the Easter festival, we commemorate the glorious Ascension of Jesus Christ. Over the past few weeks, the Gospel of John has prepared us well for this moment by speaking of Jesus' departure to the Father. After His resurrection, Jesus spent time strengthening His disciples, assuring them of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit an event we will celebrate next Sunday.

The Acts of the Apostles in the first reading vibrantly describes the Ascension of the Lord. "When he had said this, as they were

watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight" .Now that Jesus has returned to the presence of the Father, the apostles are instructed to await the descent of the Holy Spirit, who will empower them to be bold witnesses to Christ and proclaim the message of salvation in His name.

Today's Gospel presents beautifully Jesus' mission, promise, and Ascension. First, Jesus opens the minds of His disciples to understand the Scriptures. The Ascension is not simply Jesus' farewell, it is His transformation into a different mode of presence. His Ascension does not mean absence but rather a profound presence in a new and enduring way. He is seated at the right hand of the Father, He is also present in our hearts, in the Church, and through the Holy Spirit whom He has sent to guide and sanctify us.

Jesus ascends from the region of Bethany, possibly also a mountainous area. This setting is deeply symbolic. Early in His ministry, Jesus had proclaimed the Beatitudes from a mountain (Mt 5:1-3), much like God summoned the people of Israel to Mount Sinai to form them as His covenant family (Ex 19). The mountain in Galilee represents the meeting place between heaven and earth. Here, the Risen Lord solemnly declares that "all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Mt 28:18). From this sacred height, He sends the disciples into the world with the universal mission of generalization no one is excluded from the Good News or from the call to baptism in the name of the Holy Trinity (Mt 28:19-20).

Pope Francis beautifully summarizes the meaning of the Ascension: "With His Ascension, the Risen Lord draws our gaze to Heaven to show us that the goal of our journey is the Father." We are destined to return to the One from whom we came. Like the first disciples, we too are called to adore Him and remain faithful to His missionary command.

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord invites us to look upward and forward to the eternal life that awaits us. Jesus returns to the Father not only because of His divine nature, but also to prepare a place for us. His Ascension affirms our human destiny: to be with God forever. As disciples of the Ascended Lord, we are called to live in joyful expectation, hope, and trust in His promised return.

### Let us ask ourselves:

- Do I truly believe in life after death and the promise of eternal life with Christ?
- Do I live my earthly life with faith, adoration, and purpose, preparing myself for heaven?
- Do I experience God's presence in my daily life, even when He seems distant?
- How does the resurrection and ascension of Jesus help me see continuity between my earthly journey and heavenly destiny?

Let the Ascension remind us: Christ has not left us behind He has gone ahead of us, so that where He is, we too may be. Thank you for your generous contribution and sacrifices. May Jesus Bless you all.

## The Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11 | Eph 1:17-23 | Mt 28:16-20

### **GROW AS A DISCIPLE** | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

This year, I cannot help but notice how kingdom-centric the readings for the Solemnity of the Ascension are. In our first reading, Jesus appears to his disciples for forty days after his resurrection and speaks to them about the kingdom of God. Our psalm beckons us to rejoice that God is mounting his throne – another kingdom image! Our second reading tells us that God has given Christ authority over “every principality, power, and dominion” – a clear sign that he is the one reigning over all. These references seem to be telling us that today’s feast is Jesus’ “coronation day” – the day he takes his rightful place at the right hand of the Father. From the moment Jesus ascends to heaven, he is reigning. What a consoling thought for us, who may at times find ourselves discouraged by our lives or the state of affairs around us. We have hope because we know that despite appearances to the contrary, Jesus reigns, and it is only a matter of time until the Father puts all things beneath Christ’s feet.

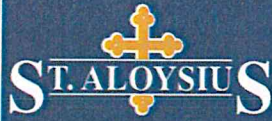
### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### **PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

In today’s Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples – and us – to “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.” It’s a tall order – bringing every nation under the reign of Christ. But we needn’t be intimidated. The Ascension offers us hope, for – as the *Catechism* reminds us – “Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit.” (667) Jesus ascended into heaven and now is constantly interceding for us before the Father, constantly pouring out his Spirit on us! In all our efforts to evangelize, we have that constant support and grace being sent our way to equip us for this work.

### **REFLECT**

Oftentimes, we think of the Ascension as Jesus leaving us after the end of his earthly ministry. But Jesus promises that he does not leave us, but rather, that he is always with us, “until the end of the age.” Spend some time this week reflecting on the ways that, having taken his seat at the right hand of the Father, Jesus is now ever-more present, pouring out his grace and his Spirit upon us at every moment.
