

Pastor Notes



November 22, 2015

Dear Fellow Parishioners.

Today is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the conclusion of the liturgical year. It was ninety years ago when this solemnity was first observed at the conclusion of the Holy Year 1925 by Pope Pius XI. Originally celebrated in

October, it was moved to Last (34th) Sunday of Ordinary Time following the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65). As Americans, we may not appreciate the regal terminology. Christ's coronation was far from regal; today's Gospel passage recalls the interrogation between Jesus and Pilate. Jesus accepts His Kingship for our behalf. How do we respond?

Later this week, our nation celebrates Thanksgiving Day. There will be Mass at 9:15 am in the main church on Thanksgiving Day. While not a holy day of obligation, I invite you to celebrate the Eucharist (which means thanksgiving) with your parish family. In observance of the Thanksgiving holiday, the parish office will close at noon on Wednesday, November 25. We will resume regular parish hours on Monday, November 30. In the case of emergency, please call the parish number and follow the instructions. Eucharistic adoration will be suspended on November 26-27 and will resume on December 3-4. Masses on Friday, November 27 and Saturday, November 28 will be at 9:15 am in the Trinity Chapel.

This Thanksgiving is the 226th anniversary of the original presidential proclamation. Our first president, George Washington, designated Thursday, November 26, 1789 as "a day of prayer and giving thanks." The President commanded "a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God ... and also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech him to pardon our national and other transgressions..." Other presidential proclamations would follow. Abraham Lincoln called for establishing a national holiday in 1863 (in the midst of the Civil War). Franklin Roosevelt fixed the fourth Thursday of November as the specific date (1939). In 1962, John Kennedy gave the historical roots for Thanksgiving with the sole credit given to the pilgrims in Massachusetts (1621). There were earlier "thanksgivings" in the New World: Berkeley Plantation (VA) in 1619, St. Augustine (FL) in 1565 and Palo Dura Canyon (TX) in 1541 by Coronado and his men. These rich origins lead us to our present day observance, including lots of food and games (for us, football). I hope that you enjoy this day with family and friends; above all, thank the Lord for all your blessings.

The season of Advent begins with the anticipatory Mass on Saturday, November 28 at 5:30 pm. While not a penitential season like Lent, there will be an expanded schedule for the Sacrament of Penance. Check the schedule at the Reconciliation Room and postings in the narthex. This is a spiritual way to prepare for the annual celebration of our Lord's Nativity.


