Dear People of the Parish,

By now, Christmas 2015 is a memory. I still have some decorations up. Just last Friday, the 15<sup>th</sup>, the parish staff was at the rectory for our annual Christmas party. No need to rush the

season! But now, the Church has returned to Ordinary Time for about one month. There may be some poinsettia around, but the trees and decorations are put away. The nativity scene was a big hit. Thanks to the Men family who put it together. Our Art and Environment committee, with many volunteers, decorated on December 20 and was able to dismantle everything this past week. Now, things return to normal; there are no particular holy days or solemnities until Ash Wednesday and the forty days of Lent. Until then, let's use these days of transition to anticipate the penance of Lent.

Contribution statements for 2015 are being prepared and will be sent by month's end. Our parish depends on your regular support. We still run behind on our anticipated collections. I am grateful for the 67% of registered parishioners who support our efforts. Sunday collections and direct deposit allows us to serve our ever-growing parish. I am proud of our parish staff serving generously and within our means. Soon, we will be preparing for next year's budget.

Last October, Fr. Stan Witek was transferred to St. Peter's Church in Douglas. At that time, we were unable to provide a proper farewell. On Sunday, February 7, I am hosting an afternoon for Fr. Witek. (Just before Christmas, I had lunch with Fr. Stan. His new kitchen needs some attention.) So, I registered at Bed, Bath and Beyond and Target to help upgrade his kitchen. Gift cards for these stores are welcomed, too. Stop by Marian Hall between 2 pm and 5 pm on Sunday, February 7. This will be a nice surprise for Father as a thank you for the three years he served here at St. Catherine's.

Guidelines for the celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Weddings are a special and joyful time for brides and grooms, for their families, and for the parish community. The Church welcomes its members to celebrate their wedding in the full spirit of this blessed sacrament.

To allow sufficient time for adequate preparation, diocesan policy requires that a couple contact a priest or deacon of the parish at least six months prior to the desired wedding date. A wedding date will be reserved on the parish calendar only after an introductory meeting has taken place with a priest. Contact the Parish Secretary to schedule an appointment with the priest to determine the eligibility for marriage and any other questions regarding our guidelines here at St. Catherine's. 


### Join the March for Life - January 22, 2016
