

Ken's Kaleidoscope

February 19, 2017

Would you allow me to think out loud with you?. Based on the belief that the Spirit is **always** present, regardless of the circumstances and how things appear, I believe that the Spirit is present in American society right now.

Based on my perception that our country is extremely divided (and therefore our community is divided, our state is divided, our parish is divided, and our families are divided), then what might the Spirit be (trying to) do in these circumstances?

Jesus' extended heartfelt prayer at the Last Supper (John, chapters 14-17) concludes with a prayer for unity: *"I pray not only for [these disciples], but for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one . . ."* (John 17: 20-23a)

How do we get to unity, such a unity that it is the same union that Jesus has with his Father? I would suggest that one means to get there is *dialogue*.

I think that dialogue is very different than arguing. Dialogue requires active listening and understanding as much as clear thinking and articulation. Dialogue is not positioned towards a winner and a loser. Dialogue does not start with the presumption that one side is right and the other one is wrong. Dialogue cannot happen when the presumption is that I am going to convince you that you are stupid for the opinion that you hold. Dialogue is not supported when the thinking is black & white, either/or, always/never, everyone & no one. (Some things may turn out to be "all or nothing," but I believe that dualistic thinking cannot be the starting point).

The dilemma in the Church (as I see it) is that sometimes we start with the presumption that we are right and we have the whole truth – so then how can we have a dialogue? Who would want to have a conversation with us if that is our starting point? But if we start with an idea that there are things that we can learn from one another, then a constructive conversation can take place. On 23 September 2015, Pope Francis spoke about this to the Bishops of the United States:

Dialogue is our method, not as a shrewd strategy but out of fidelity to the One who never wearies of visiting the marketplace, even at the eleventh hour, to propose his offer of love (Mt 20:1-16).

The path ahead, then, is dialogue among yourselves, dialogue in your presbyterates, dialogue with lay persons, dialogue with families, dialogue with society. I cannot ever tire of encouraging you to dialogue fearlessly.

Pope Francis was speaking to the bishops about dialogue taking place within the Church, and between the Church and society. I believe we can bring the same attitude to our church as well as the political circumstances we live in now. Can we have conversations in our families, with our neighbors and fellow parishioners, intending to have a dialogue of listening and learning rather than an argument to convince and win? Can we allow room for the guidance of the Spirit who is so much wiser than any of us?

My apologies go to the Boys Scouts in our parish. I presided at the Mass when we celebrated Scout Sunday, and then failed to even make mention of them. I'm glad we have a Boy Scout Troop here, and I invite young men to consider joining. I have great memories of my many years as a Boy Scout. You can contact Paul Franz at 269.903.5359.

We are getting ready to create the **March—May 2017 Liturgical Ministry schedule**. If you do NOT have email/internet access, please contact Kendra Stampor (978-2332) by **Monday, February 20th** if you need to make any changes to your profile or scheduling preferences or if you have dates you are unavailable between March 1st and May 31st. Thank you!

The **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults** is the process of welcoming and formation those are interested or have decided they want to be a member of the Catholic Church. It has several stages during which people can come to ask questions; learn about who we are and what we believe and do as Catholics; become “catechumens,” and form a small community with those on the same journey.

Other people may already be baptized Christians of another denomination and interested in becoming Catholics. There is a revised process for them, and they are called “candidates.” And then there are Catholics who for some reason never received the Sacrament of Confirmation and we’ll be glad to help you too, which may be a shorter process depending on your circumstances. We are trying to respond appropriately to each person’s unique history and need rather than treat everyone the same – because they’re not!

We are now “up and running,” and we are also inviting parishioners to join us as we fulfill this vital mission of the Church. You might be a host for small gatherings in your home; be a catechist for a group of catechumens, or someone on Sunday who meets with Catechumens to discuss the Word of God. We also will need sponsors who accompany one catechumen on their journey of faith.

So we invite interested people to call or write so that we can help you or you can help us. Narcia in the parish office (269.327.5165) or Fr. Ken (269.488.7334) will be glad to hear from you.

PRAYER LINE MINISTRY

Did you know...

- The Prayer Line receives about 70-80 requests per month.
- There are dedicated prayer partners praying every day for the needs of our parish?

You can contact (269) 978-2344 or email prayers@stcatherinesiena.org any time of day or night to request prayers for yourself or someone in need.

Can you help support this vital ministry? We are in need of additional volunteers in all areas. No prior experience or meetings are required – *only a prayerful heart*. Training is provided.

- **Prayer Line Coordinators** regularly check phone/email messages from the Prayer Line during their scheduled week and usually cover one week per month. They assign new prayer requests to Prayer Team Captains. (Must have email access.)
- **Prayer Team Captains** receive new prayer requests from the Coordinator. They contact 4-5 members of their prayer team by phone. There are generally 1 or 2 requests per month.
- **Prayer Partners (“Prayer Warriors”)** include prayer intention in their daily personal prayer for 30 days. Each request deserves dedicated prayer time, so there is never more than one new request per week.


