

Dear Parishioners,

Where were you in 1971? Fifty years ago, our diocese was created and formed from parts of the Diocese of Lansing and Grand Rapids. In July of that year, several other dioceses were created in Michigan (Gaylord and Saginaw). All of us will be celebrating our

50<sup>th</sup> anniversaries later this month.

As the diocese rolls out the plans for this anniversary celebration, we can thank God for the many blessings that the Lord has shown to the faithful of Southwestern Michigan. When our diocese was created, these were the early days after the Council of Vatican II. We were all just learning what it was like to celebrate Mass in English versus Latin. Of course, as part of these 50 years of faith, no one anticipated a shut down due to a pandemic. We see how each one of these 50 years has brought challenges and blessings. As we celebrate the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, our Independence Day, this is also the final weekend that Fr. Jeff will be on staff at St. Catherine. He will be moving to live at the Cathedral rectory and has already started his work as the Diocesan Director of Worship (the anniversary Mass will be one of his first large diocesan liturgies that he will help plan). Our prayers and thoughts are with you Fr. Jeff as you begin your new ministry. Due to the fact that there are no new priests or missionaries for the Bishop to send us at this time, no additional priests will be assigned to St. Catherine's at this time.

With the changing protocols and guidelines, please note the following:

## **Sunday Connection**

#### **First Reading**

**Ezekiel 2:2-5** 

The Lord sends the prophet Ezekiel to the Israelites.

#### **Responsorial Psalm**

Psalm 123:1-2,3-4

A prayer to God for mercy

#### **Second Reading**

2 *Corinthians* 12:7-10

Paul bears insults and weakness for the sake of Christ.

#### **Gospel Reading**

Mark 6:1-6

Jesus is rejected in his hometown.

#### **Background on the Gospel Reading**

This Gospel immediately follows upon last week's stories of the raising of Jairus's daughter and the healing of the woman with a hemorrhage. It sets the context of our Gospel readings for the next two weeks in which Jesus will extend the work of his ministry to his disciples.

Today's Gospel describes what many believe to have been the typical pattern of Jesus' ministry: teaching in the synagogue followed by acts of healing. In his hometown of Nazareth, the people are amazed by what they hear, but they also cannot comprehend how someone they know so well might move them so powerfully.

In this Gospel, we learn some interesting details about Jesus and his early life. Jesus' kinfolk know him to be a carpenter, an artisan who works in wood, stone, and metal. He probably learned this trade from his father. Family members of Jesus are also named. Mark describes Jesus as the son of Mary, which is an unusual designation. Adult males were more typically identified with the name of their fathers. It is unclear why Mark deviates from this custom.

Brothers and sisters of Jesus are also named. Scholars are divided on how to interpret this. As Catholics, we believe that Mary was and remained always a virgin, thus we do not believe that this Gospel refers to other children of Mary. Some have suggested that these family members might be Joseph's children from a previous marriage, but there is little evidence to support this. Others explain this reference by noting that the words *brother* and *sister* were often used to refer to other types of relatives, including cousins, nieces, and nephews.

This Gospel tells us that Jesus is hampered from performing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Jesus is said to be surprised by this. He did not predict or foresee this rejection. In this detail we find a description of the very human side of Jesus.

This passage unfolds a continuing theme of Mark's Gospel: Who is Jesus? His kinfolk in Nazareth might know the carpenter, the son of Mary, but they do not know Jesus, the Son of God. Mark is foreshadowing Jesus' rejection by his own people, the people of Israel. He is also reflecting on and trying to explain the situation of the community for which he wrote. While many of the first Christians were Jewish, Christianity took hold and flourished in the Gentile community. Mark's community was mostly a Gentile community, who may have been experiencing persecution. By showing that Jesus himself was rejected, Mark consoles and reassures his first readers. He also prepares us to accept this possible consequence of Christian discipleship.

To celebrate our COVID Independence, Primetimers is meeting at Main Street Pub, 7509 S Westnedge Ave, Portage 49002 at 11:15 am on Monday, July 5. This is the "holiday" celebration of July 4th this year. Main St. Pub is not yet taking reservations but will seat you on a first come first served basis. They do have outdoor seating

Before the Second Vatican Council, there was only one reading at Sunday Mass known as the epistle (from one of the Apostles' letters in the New Testament). Vatican II promoted liturgical renewal and aimed to immerse the faithful more fully in the Scriptures. This resulted in Sunday Masses and holy days having a First Reading (from the Old Testament) and a Second Reading (from the New Testament). At this time, the Church also started a three-year cycle for Sunday Mass readings to ensure that a faithful Catholic will go through the whole history of salvation every three years.

## Did You Know: What is a Sacristan?

Did you know that a Sacristan is an important office that has existed for most of the history of the Church? At cathedrals and collegiate churches (no association with educational institutions!), a sacristan must be part of the clergy, and normally a Sacristan is desired to be clergy by the Church. Since the number of clergy is limited at many parishes, most Sacristans are laypersons.

A Sacristan's duty is preparation for the liturgy, which includes tasks such as: laying out vestments, lighting candles, setting out liturgical vessels, arranging books needed for the celebration and marking pages, and even maintaining a

sacred silence in the sacristy prior to Mass. A good Sacristan is well versed in liturgical norms, books and the liturgical calendar to ensure great attention is given to preparation for the liturgy. A Sacristan fulfills an important role in the liturgy, and according to the Ceremonial of Bishops (No.38), this individual should "make the church a visible sign of love and reverence toward God."

As we continue to welcome everyone back to in-person Masses, we need more Sacristans to help us with all Masses. We are so appreciative of all of the Sacristans who have continued to serve the parish week after week during these challenging times! We literally couldn't do it without you!
