

Reflection on the Readings

The Pharisee in today's gospel parable seems glaringly self-centered and pretentious in giving thanks to God that he is not like other sinners: greedy, dishonest or adulterous. He feels especially superior to the tax collector despised by the Jewish community for collaborating with the Romans. In sharp contrast we find this tax collector standing off at a distance from the temple. He knows he is a sinner, confesses this to God and asks for His mercy. Jesus tells his disciples the tax collector went home justified (transformed by God's love and forgiveness) while the Pharisee did not. Before we judge the Pharisee too harshly, however, keep in mind he has lived faithful to God's commandments as he understood them per the cultural norms and religious practices at that time. What Jesus is trying to get His disciples (and us) to understand is that the Pharisee was missing a critical point in his prayer. By focusing on his own righteous acts, he was not making himself present to God. He wasn't inviting God to be present to him either. He was missing the opportunity to encounter God in a relationship and receive his mercy and grace. The Pharisee left the Temple basically the same way he had entered, focused on himself instead of God. The tax collector, on the other hand, approached God with humility and honesty longing to draw closer to God despite his unworthiness. Jesus ends the parable by summarizing the essential difference between the two men, "for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Do we truly open our hearts to God and ask Him to come in when we pray? Or do we "go through the motions" of prayer, concerned only with our own "wants," and miss the opportunity to grow in our relationship with God?



Opposing Proposal 3

WEEK 5

We've used the last month to shine a spotlight on the extraordinarily broad language used in Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal) that will appear on the ballot this November. The proposal does far more than simply codify *Roe v. Wade* in our State Constitution. As we've discussed, Proposal 3 invalidates more than two dozen Michigan pro-life laws, authorizes minors to obtain abortion and sterilization without parental consent or even notice, effectively allows abortion through all 9 months of pregnancy, and prohibits the Stat from enacting laws that would protect an unborn baby's life or even to stop abortions based on sex, race, or disability.

At least women would be protected from unsafe abortion practices, right? Not at all. Proposal 3 authorizes the State to pass limited laws protecting the health of the mother, but only "consistent with accepted clinical standards of practice and evidence-based medicine." Who establishes "accepted clinical standards of practice" for abortions? Abortionists! Unlike any other area of medical practice, where doctors

and nurses are subjected to all manner of laws to ensure patient safety, abortionists alone would get to decide whether they want to follow a Michigan health and safety law. If abortionists disagree that hospital admitting privileges are important, they can decline to follow a law that requires them. If abortionists think that laws regulating the safety standards for surgical centers are unnecessary for abortion clinics, they can ignore them with impunity.

No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Michigan's Constitution should *not* be amended to give abortionists complete control over deciding what Michigan health and safety laws they must follow. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th.

John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Through Alliance Defending Freedom, he represents the Michigan Catholic Conference and Right to Life of Michigan in court to uphold Michigan's pro-life laws.

They love spending time with their children and nine grandchildren, allowing them to visit Montana, New York and St. Louis. Dale and Joan look forward to making new friends through being active within the parish. If you have yet to meet the Gerbers, please make an effort to say hello and thank them for all they do! The Lord had a purpose when bringing them to Portage, and while the reason for their move was heartbreaking, we are very thankful that the Lord blessed our parish family with Joan and Dale.
