

## **Reflection on the Readings**

Jesus' words in today's Gospel passage are startling, and a bit scary taken at face value. "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple." And again, "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." How are we to take this message?

Our God knows the world we live in; He knows we all have responsibilities to various people and institutions. I don't believe Jesus is telling us to abandon our relationships with our loved ones and friends, or to walk away from all our responsibilities. Rather than a call to irresponsibility, I see this message as a call to a greater, altered responsibility. The first commandment says to love God with all your heart, soul, strength, etc. God must be first in our lives, above everyone and everything else. But, how do we show our love for God? It isn't enough to read scripture and pray, although certainly those things are important. The way we truly show our love for God is through loving our neighbors as ourselves...words put into action. The message in today's Gospel, then, is a call to reorient our thoughts and actions away from selfishness and self-centeredness towards generosity and love for others. All our thoughts and actions should be centered around Jesus and His teachings; we need to see the world and live in the world as Jesus did. This means putting others ahead of ourselves; their needs and wants come first, even if that means making a sacrifice.

What things keep you from putting God first in everything you do? We all have something that we hold onto dearly...possessions, titles, security, our time, bad habits, etc. We all need to see how we can adjust our priorities to put others first. We can't do it alone; as the first reading tells us. We need God's grace to first identify and then work to correct these issues. Thankfully, God's grace is free for the asking.

Dear Parishioners,

When the news broke about a week and a half ago about a shooting at a Catholic Church and School in Minneapolis, most of us took a pause. We have heard a lot about school shootings in recent years, but this one was much different. Not only did this take place at a Catholic Church, but the shooter was actually attacking during the Opening School Mass. Our prayers continue for the victims and families affected by this tragedy.

I write this letter to the parish this weekend to address safety issues and concerns at St. Catherine. After the shooting took place in Minneapolis, Bishop Lohse sent out a directive asking schools and parishes to make sure that we are doing what we can to keep everyone safe. He expressed the need to take a look at what we can do to keep safety and security in mind, especially when our youth are in the buildings. Over the past couple years, our staff and St. Catherine clergy have already been talking about this very subject and have some things in place. Two years to three years ago, we already implemented more security cameras in both buildings (inside and out) and have changed the door locking schedule for the main building during the work week and for the weekends. We no longer can leave the doors open all day long. I know that this hasn't always been a popular thing to do. It's a hard thing to balance time for people to stop by and pray and to ensure the safety of parishioners, students and staff when they are in the building. Knowing that people still need access to the building, even though the doors may be locked sometimes; however, if you can see a light in the office during office hours, we are open. Please use the doorbell in the narthex (main) entry to have a staff person assist you. Our faith formation programs involve a large number of students as well as our summer Vacation Bible School. We need to keep looking at ways to keep everyone safe.

After the tornado, many of our fences were torn down and we have been replacing them. In fact, when the City of Portage was onsite and doing inspections during our rebuilding, they told us that we needed to fence in our property and restrict access from the neighborhood. Those who have been around for a while know that there used to be an exit at the northern end of the property, right by the Stanley Centre, that allowed people to exit into the neighborhoods off of Schuring Road. Most of the road that went to that exit is no longer visible and posts were placed in front of the old entrance so that vehicles could no longer enter the property this way. Pedestrian access is still possible, and a number of people come through that area each day. With the request of the Bishop to make our campuses safer, the next thing that needs to be done is to FULLY close off that area so that pedestrians can no longer access our property from Schuring. Plans are underway to make that happen.

Yes, times have changed. I never imagined we would need to talk and think about things like this, especially at a church! Please be patient as all these things are a work in progress and our staff continues to value your safety and make improvements as necessary when you are on the St. Catherine Church campus.


