



REFLECTION FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: Light is a common theme in this week's Gospel, and truly throughout much of the Bible. While Jesus is available to us all – He wants a relationship with everyone – we each need to take on an active role in receiving the light and letting this light shine through all that we think, say, and do.

We each have to give Jesus permission to be our light. An example here might be that we like to talk negatively about people when they are not around. This is not being kind and certainly places the person we are talking about, and ourselves, in the darkness. We need to give Jesus permission to shine on our negative talk, change around what we are saying to the kind words of Jesus and the light of Jesus will shine ever brighter as we act like Him and grow closer in our relationship with Him.
