



REFLECTION FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT: Jesus rose from the dead. If this isn't enough to convince us that this man Jesus wasn't just some teacher or idea but is actually the Son of God in the flesh... We have to ask ourselves why wouldn't we follow Him and seek to mold our lives after His example?

However, the Gospel of John chapter 11 and the rising of Lazarus helps us to see that the finality of death, at least looking at death from just the physical perspective, is the end that we don't get to come back from. It is the final event of our earthly life and that is that. In John's account of this story, he uses the word "believe" 8 times, I think to both stress how difficult it is for humans to accept this while also getting to the reality that with Jesus, and our belief in Him, He can do anything and this includes even conquering death.

I think this exhortation to believe from the Gospel is meant for you and I this day. Believe in Jesus that He can raise us from our tombs of worry, sadness, fear, sickness, etc. and show us the glimpse of our future of heavenly peace and joy of eternity with Him who is the resurrection and the life.
