



Knights of Columbus Farmers Breakfast: Our next breakfast is Sunday February 9th after the 8:00 and 11:00 am Mass. There is no better way to celebrate Super Bowl Sunday then to begin with Mass and this breakfast! And even better, proceeds from this breakfast will support the Knights of Columbus initiative "Refund Support Vocations Program or RSVP", which "through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians and men and women religious postulants and novices in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of the RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian, postulant or novice with moral support and prayers for their success" (from the www.kofc.org website). This year, this particular breakfast will support Deacon Paul Thuantho, a Theology IV student whose home parish is St. Joseph in Battle Creek. SAFE ENVIRONMENT To comply with the policies and procedures set forth by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Kalamazoo Office of Safe Environment, the information below is run once per month in parish bulletins: The Diocese of Kalamazoo has and will continue to cooperate with the Michigan Attorney General's investigation and encourages anyone with information related to misconduct to call the reporting number set-up by the Michigan Attorney General's office at: 844.324.3374. The Catholic Bishop Abuse Reporting Service (CBAR) has been established to receive reports of sexual abuse and related misconduct by bishops and to relay those reports to proper Church authorities for investigation. To make a report, visit ReportBishopAbuse.org or phone (800) 276-1562. When a report includes a crime, such as the sexual abuse of a minor, it will also be reported to civil authorities. Otherwise, reports will be kept confidential.

REFLECTION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: One of the ways you can come to know God is as Truth. God is the author of truth, setting up what is right and what is wrong. You and I, as His beloved children who He wants to share His divine life with, are given this knowledge of truth, built into our hearts. When we hear the truth spoken, when we listen to and know what is right or wrong in our heart, we experience God present.

Now, once we hear the truth, what do we do with it? St. Paul mentions in his letter to the Corinthians that every single one of us is a member of Christ's body. Be a source of comfort and patience to those patients you interact with throughout your day. 
