<u>Deacon's Corner</u>

The Paschal Candle

We see the Paschal Candle, or the Easter Candle, placed in an area of prominence in the sanctuary of the church. But it is not always there. Why? And what is this significance of this candle?

The Paschal Candle has been a central part of our Catholic tradition since the early Church. Its origin can be traced back to the fourth century, and its symbolism has evolved and developed over time. Today, it is an integral part of the Easter Vigil liturgy, the most important celebration in the Church calendar.

As the name suggests, the Paschal Candle is closely associated with the Paschal Mystery – the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It represents the triumph of light over darkness and life over death. Its use in the liturgy symbolizes the presence of the risen Christ among His people and serves as a reminder of His victory over sin and death.

There are distinct decorations that adorn the candle. The cross on it serves as a reminder of Christ's sacrifice and His victory over death. It is a symbol of hope and salvation for all believers. The Greek letters Alpha and Omega represent the eternal nature of God as mentioned in the Book of Revelation where Jesus says, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end" – the eternal God who transcends time.

The five grains of incense inserted into the candle recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb and of the five wounds in his hands, feet, and side. The Pascal Candle is marked with the current year to remind us that God is here with us today and is constantly guiding all creation to Himself.

During the Easter season – which goes from Easter Sunday until the Feast of Pentecost, fifty days after Easter – the candle remains near the ambo (the pulpit where the readings and homily are proclaimed) and is lit every time the church gathers for the liturgy. Outside of the Easter season, the candle is found near the baptismal font in our parish. It is used for funerals to represent the light of life that conquers the darkness of the tomb, and for baptisms because this sacrament enlightens us and gives us the light of faith.

The Paschal Candle is not just a mere decoration, but a powerful symbol of the Resurrection and the ultimate victory of Christ over sin and death. So, whenever we gaze upon its beauty may its flame ignite our faith, fill our hearts with hope and love, and be a

reminder of Christ's triumph over sin and death.
