**PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Parish Family:

The scandal of the cross is particularly poignant within the context of the contentious atmosphere of today's society. Self-righteousness seems to reign in discussions within Church and secular circles. Compromise and respect are lost virtues. The cross brings the focus both to the vertical and the horizontal relationships that are essential and life-giving. The fundamental longing of the human heart is for union with God; but, even the hermit must get to God in, with, and through his or her neighbor. The two great commandments of Jesus go hand-in-hand: love of God and love of neighbor. One flows naturally to the other and back and forth. The whole point of the cross is both to divide the follower of Christ from the rest of humanity and to unite all who attempt to follow Him. The devil wants nothing more than to divide us from one another. In the context of a gathering of priests last month to discuss the current crisis of clergy sexual abuse, a prophetic voice reminded us all of this profound truth. Today many voices will express opinions and ask questions concerning the Church we love. I pray that we will not forget the focus on the cross and whose body hangs from it!


The U12 girls team two beat St. John the Baptist 3 to 2 while the U12 boys team one had an 8 to 2 victory over St. John the Baptist's boys team.

Luke's desire is to show that Christianity belongs to the larger world of the Roman empire. For example, he links the birth of Jesus to the Emperor Caesar Augustus. Luke calls his work a narrative account, not a history; his gospel is a faith narrative, not a biography or history of Jesus Christ. Luke's purpose is to show that what the church preaches is rooted in the ministry of Jesus and the preaching of the Apostles.

Luke provides authenticity of the Christian message by showing that the Holy Spirit has guided the entire process from the Old Testament through the ministry of Jesus and the development of the Church in the early Christian community.

Beginnings are important. If we want to know what kind of book we are reading, we skim over the first few pages to see its type. If we want to know what point of view the author takes, we examine how she or he starts out. For these reasons, among others, it is important to recognize the special character of the first five books of the Old Testament, i.e., the *Torah*, the Law of Moses. They stand apart as an introduction to the entire Bible, and more importantly both the Jewish and Christian faiths recognize them as the foundation on which all of Holy Scripture is built.
