PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The words spirit, wind, and breath are, essentially the same word in Hebrew. Thus, the same Spirit:

- At the moment of creation as a mighty wind swept over the waters
- At the cave as a tiny whispering sound experienced by the prophet Elijah
- Breathed by Jesus upon the apostles
- Breathed by the bishop upon the oil of chrism used in the sacraments of baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders

That same breath of God has come upon us as a people and called us to be a liberating and healing presence in a broken and sinful world. The word Pentecost comes from the Greek word for fifty. It was a Jewish agricultural feast that was celebrated fifty days (or seven weeks) after the Feast of Unleavened Bread. It marked the end of the grain harvest and commemorated the giving of the Law on Mt. Sinai. The Law is the sign or seal of the covenant between God and the people of Israel. The Christian feast called *Pentecost* celebrates the bestowal of the promised *Paraclete* or *Advocate* upon the eleven apostles, the seal of the new covenant of grace won for us through the blood of the Lamb. Just as at Sinai, the twelve tribes became a people; so, in the Upper Room, the eleven apostles and other close followers of Jesus (including his mother) became the *quhal*, *ecclesia*, church. Thus, this feast, which concludes the Easter season, is truly the Birthday of the Church!

This solemn feast brings the fifty days of Easter to an end. Tomorrow we resume the "ordinary time" of the Church. One who symbolizes clearly the "ordinary" in an "extraordinary" way is Mary, the mother of God. A year ago, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, established the Monday after Pentecost as the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. We will resume our journey through the Gospel of Luke on June 30. Jesus invites the apostles and us to follow him to Jerusalem. On our way, we are accompanied by Mary as we finger the beads that tell the story of our salvation. Obstacles and sufferings threaten to obscure our way; but the intercession of a mother will help us overcome all sin and fear and will lead us to an encounter with her Son!


