PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parish Family & Visitors:

The summer pilgrimages to rejuvenating places of reunion and rest have begun in earnest. The theme of travel is also the motif for the gospel of Luke. As we heard on the last Sunday of June, Jesus had set his course towards Jerusalem where he would fulfill his mission. Along the way, he imparted many lessons to his companions and those they would meet. The genuine follower of Jesus has to learn to do great things with few resources, to depend on the kindness of others, and to give beyond without the expectation of receiving. Hospitality was not an option in the brutal heat of the desert; but its rewards were and are more than can be imagined. What must I bring for my spiritual journey? Two requirements come to mind: prayer and Eucharist – the food for the journey. Little else matters. Perhaps the somewhat less hectic days of summer can provide us with the opportunity to reflect on these essential components of the Christian life. Where and when do I pray every day? Where have I celebrated Eucharist? How have I been called to "be" Eucharist for another?

We welcome Father Magro back to Blessed Sacrament after a hiatus of 23 years! Father lived and ministered here in the 1980's and 1990's while he was pursuing advanced degrees at Catholic University. A native of Malta, Father was ordained in 1979. He spent five years in parish ministry in Germany before coming to the United States. He left Blessed Sacrament to finish his doctoral dissertation while living at Our Lady of Victory in Washington and working at the Library of Congress. He returned to Malta at the request of his bishop to direct a minor seminary. In 2013, Father took a position as a teacher of the science and art of teaching the faith at Catholic University. He then lived at St. Patrick's in Rockville. About two years ago, Father discerned that he was called to leave "academia" and devote his attention to parish ministry full-time. He spent the past year at St. Bernadette's in Silver Spring. Father Magro comes to us as an accomplished teacher and preacher with great experience in retreat ministry and spiritual direction.




