### PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parish Family:

Today we hear from Luke's version of the "Beatitudes." He gives us only four but adds four "woes." Crowds had gathered, but Jesus looked intently into the eyes of his disciples and described them as blessed in as much as they were poor, were hungry, were weeping and hated. Jesus also looks into our eyes and knows better than we do our human condition. The prophet Jeremiah calls us to a radical trust in God and described those who trust in human beings as "cursed." Paul regards those whose hopes are tied only to this world as pitiable.

The consistent message I receive from reflecting on these words is simply that if I but trust in the Lord unimaginable and wonderful things can and will happen. Today I am inviting you to consider how your trust in the past has enabled this parish to be among the most generous contributors to the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal.

Our new Coordinator of Social Concerns, Jessica Walsh, will introduce herself at all Masses and tells us how she intends to continue the work of her immediate predecessor, Patricia Kavanaugh. The brochure in the pews describes the multiple ministries funded by the Appeal. Among these are the ministries of Catholic Charities (with whom Jessica will work) and the formation of seminarians. Ten are scheduled to be ordained priests this year!

I see the Annual Appeal as a part of our Lenten almsgiving. Lent begins on March 2. I hope that every household will participate in this act of kindness and demonstration of gratitude for God's abundant blessings. I thank you in advance for all your generosity!

## THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

### PARISH OSSUARY

In 1997 permission was granted for Catholic parishes to celebrate the funeral liturgy with cremated remains present. While a white pall is not used in the funeral liturgy with cremated remains, a suitable and handsomely designed ossuary may be used. It is a hand-crafted receptacle (in our parish, it is made of solid oak, stained and decorated with Gothic tracery - as found in our windows, etc.). The funeral urn or box is placed inside by the funeral director or family members at the beginning of the liturgy. The ossuary is then taken to the church door at the conclusion of the liturgy and the urn removed by family or the funeral director. In use in Europe for many years, the custom is fairly new to the United States but growing as more Catholics choose cremation. An ossuary assures that all are given their rightful dignity during the funeral liturgy and we highly recommend its use. We are grateful to the Sanctuary Sodality for this beautiful gift.

From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

*"The cremated remains of a body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. This includes the use of a worthy vessel to contain the ashes, the manner in which they are carried, and the care and attention to appropriate placement and transport, and the final disposition. The cremated remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium."*




