REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S READINGS

Can our faith transform us into someone new? Abram and Sarai were an elderly childless couple living contentedly with his family. Then God told Abram to move to a new land where he would be the father of a great nation. Though the transformation comes later, today we hear its promise and see Abram's obedient response. We know that soon God will change their names to Abraham and Sarah as an outward sign of their transformation. In the second reading, we hear from another faithful person whom God renamed, Paul, who had been named Saul. Writing to Timothy, Paul reminds him that their lives were transformed, as was life itself, by the resurrection of Christ Jesus. This brings us to Jesus' visible transformation in the Gospel. Jesus is transfigured before the eyes of his closest friends. As at his baptism, God speaks from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him" (Matthew 17:5). So we listen, as did they. His first words when this vision was complete were, "Rise, and do not be afraid" (Matthew 17:7). They did so, as did Abraham and Sarah, and Paul & Timothy. Now it is incumbent upon us to do the same, trusting God, always willing to be transformed.

MEDITATION OF THE DAY

"The Eucharist is alive!" If a stranger who knew nothing about the Eucharist were to watch the way we receive, would he know this? When you and I approach the Eucharist, does it look like we believe we are about to take into our bodies the living person, Jesus Christ, true God and true man? How many times, Lord, have I forgotten that the Eucharist is alive! As I wait in line to receive you each day, am I thinking about how much you want to unite yourself with me? Am I seeking your hands filled with the graces you want to give me?

In the Gospel Jesus is transfigured. His face shines like the sun, his clothes become white as light. He is joined by his closest friends, as well as Moses and Elijah. They hear God's voice from the cloud: "This is my beloved Son" (Matthew 17:5). In just a few weeks Jesus will be disfigured. He will be struck, scourged, spat upon, and mocked with a crown of thorns. Spikes will pierce his hands and feet as he is nailed to a cross. His friends will have abandoned him. There will be no voice from a cloud: Jesus will believe himself forsaken by his Father. Bystanders will think he is calling for Elijah. We are called to accept both visions of his identity: the disfigured Victim, the transfigured Lord. Transfigured today, Jesus becomes disfigured for our sins, to be transfigured in glory in the end. God's blessings are not showered down on us as a reward for anything we have done. Abram had done nothing of significance before the passage we hear today, in which God promises to bless him in five ways (founder of a great nation, blessed personally, bless his name, bless those who bless him, curse those who curse him). Paul reminds Timothy that God saved us "not according to our works but according to (God's) own design" (2 Timothy 1:9). God's ultimate blessing, of course, is Jesus himself. We did nothing to merit his incarnation, let alone his ultimate sacrifice. Jesus' final line of today's Gospel reads like a spoiler alert: "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead" (Matthew 17:9). It is as if Peter, James, and John had seen an advance trailer that could ruin the ending for everyone else. No worries. In the next chapter of Matthew, the disciples argue over who is the greatest. It appears that they have missed the point once again. They are still struggling with God's command: "Listen to him" (17:5). Question of the Week: How can I listen to Jesus over the next week? What is he telling me?
