THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Pope Francis declared the new liturgical year as the **Year of St. Joseph.** The year begins Dec. 8th, and it is Pope Francis's hope that this year will be one, "in which every faithful following St Joseph's example can daily strengthen their life of faith in the full fulfillment of God's will."

The decree states that, "All the faithful will thus have the opportunity to commit themselves, with prayer and good works, to obtain with the help of Saint Joseph, head of the celestial Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and social tribulations that today grip the contemporary world."

Pope Francis has added indulgence opportunities to the decree. The indulgence request the individual to follow the three individual conditions—sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, and pray for the Holy Father, as well as detach oneself from sin. There are 8 ways to gain a plenary (total) indulgence during the Year of Saint Joseph:

- 1) Meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father.
- 2) Attend a spiritual day retreat that includes Saint Joseph meditation.
- 3) Carry out a corporal or spiritual work of mercy.
- 4) Recite the Holy Rosary with your family.
- 5) Entrust your day/work to Saint Joseph; invoke his protection and intercession.
- 6) Pray to Saint Joseph for persecuted Christians
- 7) Recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph.
- 8) For the elderly, sick, and dying: Recite an act of piety in Saint Joseph's honor; entrust life and discomforts to Saint Joseph.

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word that means "rejoice." The Christian steward should be characterized by a spirit of rejoicing.

Our First Reading, from Isaiah, expresses a fitting motto for us. "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." It is God Who is the source of our joy and contentment — not things or comfort, but our relationship with God.

This is why stewards can share so freely of their time, talents and material possessions — because ultimately, we are not attached to these things. We recognize them as good gifts from our loving Father, but we are attached to the Giver of the gifts, not the gifts themselves. This allows for great freedom in life and the capacity for great joy in the Lord.

We can become like John the Baptist, in today's Gospel passage from the Book of John. We read this description of the prophet: "He came for testimony, to testify to the light... He was not the light but came to testify to the light." This is our calling too — to testify to the Light, our wonderful Savior — by the way we make use of the time, talent and treasure He has entrusted to our care.

When God Himself is the source of our joy, it cannot be taken away from us. There is still time, during this Advent season, to clear away any "clutter" in our lives that may take our focus away from Him. Let us strive to detach from any of these things so that we can be free to truly rejoice in God on Christmas Day.
