



CONSTITUTIONS, ENCYCLICALS, LETTERS...

What's the difference between different types of Church documents?

There are many different Church documents, and sometimes it's not clear what level of authority each type of document carries with it. The most common include Apostolic Constitutions, encyclicals, pastoral letters, and apostolic exhortations. A brief summary of these documents from adoremus.org:

Apostolic Constitutions and Decrees issued by popes, such as documents from the Second Vatican Council: These are the top of the hierarchy. Also included at this level is the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1992) and the Code of Canon Law (1983). **These documents have binding authority on the entire Church,** and are legislative documents that contain dogmatic or doctrinal elements.

Papal teaching documents, encyclicals, apostolic letters or exhortations, and "moto proprio" documents: These documents expound upon or explain existing law.

Official documents from national conference of bishops, usually called "pastoral letters," These documents are explanations about how Church teaching applies to or is to be put into effect within a given country. These documents must always be absolutely consistent with the teaching and law of the universal Church, and to be effective, requires official confirmation by the Holy See.

CATHOLIC SHARING APPEAL 2022

The 2022 Catholic Sharing Appeal is underway!

We have over 250 registered households at Saint Thomas More, and so far 96 households have pledged.



Please prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit what your household is able to donate this year. If every household chose to pledge \$200 to CSA for the year, we would cover our entire pledge goal with leftover to cover some of the other half of our annual diocesan assessment. Giving something to CSA is a requirement in being considered a Saint Thomas More active parishioner.

SAINT THOMAS MORE MEMBER GUIDELINES

To be considered an active parishioner:

1. Fill out a *Parish Registration Form*, and turn it in to the Parish Office or the offertory.
2. Attend Mass regularly.
3. Give a **traceable** offertory to *Saint Thomas More* Parish. Traceable means using online giving, or using checks/envelopes with your name on them.
4. Prayerfully discern and give something to *Catholic Sharing Appeal* to support the mission of the Bishop and local church.

Benefits of doing these things:

- * You are prayed for daily and remembered in Masses offered for parishioners.
- * Receive a discount on rental of the Parish Hall.
- * Qualify for a school subsidy.
- * Priority use of Church for weddings and funerals.
