





A Lawyer's Prayer to Saint Thomas More

SAINT THOMAS MORE, counselor of law and statesman of integrity, merry martyr and most human of saints:

PRAY that, for the glory of GOD and in the pursuit of His justice, I may be trustworthy with confidences, keen in study, accurate in analysis, correct in conclusion, able in argument, loyal to clients, honest with all, courteous to adversaries, ever attentive to conscience. Sit with me at my desk and listen with me to my clients' tales. Read with me in my library and stand always beside me so that today I shall not, to win a point, lose my soul.

PRAY that my family may find in me what yours found in you: friendship and courage, cheerfulness and charity, diligence in duties, counsel in adversity, patience in pain—their good servant, and God's first.

AMEN.

SAINT THOMAS MORE FEBRUARY 7, 1478 - JULY 6, 1535

Saint Thomas More was born in London in 1478. At the age of 14, he entered Oxford to begin his studies to become a lawyer. He entered the legal profession in 1502 at the age of 24, but spent the first two years contemplating joining the monks in the Carthusian monastery next to his home, whom he often joined in their spiritual exercises. Although he decided to remain in the secular world, he did not forget the monks who inspired him in the practice of his faith.

Thomas married his first wife, Jane, in 1505, and together they had four children. Jane passed away in 1511, and Thomas married widow Alice Middleton, who had a daughter of from her first marriage, whom Thomas accepted as his own child. He was a good and devoted father, who wrote letters to his children when he was away from them. He also saw to it that his daughters received the same education as his son.

As a skilled theologian and writer, among Thomas More's most famous written work is *Utopia*, about a fictional, idealistic island society. It is considered one of the greatest works of the late Renaissance.

After 1517, King Henry VIII began to give Thomas posts of increasing responsibility, naming him Lord Chancellor in 1529. Thomas became one of the king's most trusted friends and advisors. However, their relationship strained when Henry sought an annulment from his wife, Catherine. More refused to sign a letter to the Pope in support of the king, and realized that King Henry desired to break away from the Church, and purge anyone who disagreed with him.

Realizing he could not support King Henry VIII, Thomas More resigned in 1530. In 1534, Thomas was ordered to acknowledge the king's annulment to Catherine, the legitimacy of his marriage to Anne Boleyn, and his position as head of the Church. His refusal to accept the king's annulment or to acknowledge Henry as head of the Church led to his imprisonment in the Tower of London.

Thomas More went to trial on 1 July 1535 and after only fifteen minutes of deliberation, was convicted of the charge of treason. On 6 July, Thomas More was executed by decapitation. On his way to the execution, he joked with the executioners who helped him up to the scaffold by saying he would see himself down. His final words proclaimed he was, "the king's good servant, but God's first."

Thomas More was and still is widely remembered as a man of enormous integrity. He was canonized in 1935 by Pope Leo XIII. He is the patron saint of lawyers, politicians, civil servants, adopted children, and difficult marriages. His feast day is celebrated on June 22. Saint Thomas More, Patron Saint of Our Parish, Pray for Us!
