- ◆ 6:00 PM on Wednesday, November 15th

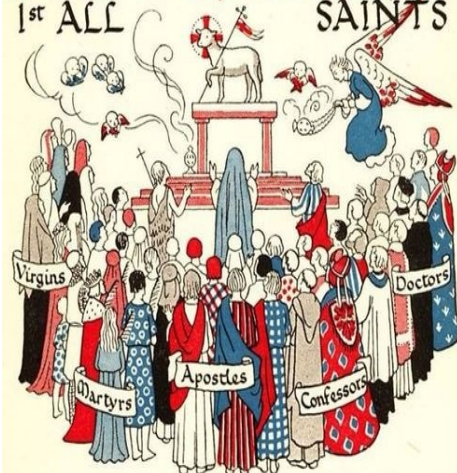

Wednesday, November 1st is All Saints Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, Halloween, or the Solemnity of All Saints. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. All Catholics are obliged to attend Mass in honor of all Saints - those who have died in friendship with God and who lived with Him now in heaven. These Saints are those who are known and all those who are unknown.

6:00 PM - Music and Incense

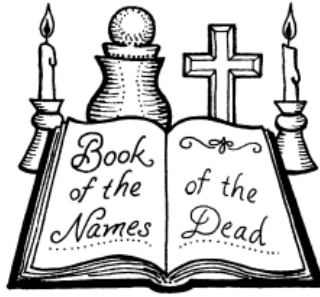
After the 6:00 PM Mass, there will be Eucharistic Adoration concluding with Benediction. OCIA will follow in the Parish Hall after Benediction.
