



OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE



The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is on December 12th, and recalls the 1531 appearance of the Virgin Mary to Saint Juan Diego, a native peasant who had recently converted to the Catholic faith, at a place called Tepeyac in what is now Mexico City. The Virgin asked that a church be built on the site. The local bishop was skeptical of Juan Diego's story, however, and requested a sign that the request was really from the Virgin Mary.

She offered the bishop several signs, beginning with the out-of-season and non-native roses that she gave to Juan to present to the bishop. When the roses tumbled from Juan's tilma (mantle or cloak), they revealed a miraculous image of the Virgin on Juan's garment. Millions of pilgrims still travel to Mexico City to venerate the miraculous image of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patron saint of Mexico as well as the Empress of the Americas.


