



WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?

It's easy to think the Ordinary in Ordinary Time stands for "same old-same old," or even "boring," but nothing isfurther from

the truth! Ordinary for us is related to "ordinal," or a way to rank, number, or order things.

Christmas Easter Times highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, the Incarnation, death on the Cross, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, take us through the life of Christ. **This is the time of conversion.** This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.
