WHO RECEIVES THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

The General Introduction sets forth the norm that the anointing of the sick is intended for "those of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age" "(PCS 8). A person who is facing surgery may be anointed if the reason for the surgery is a serious illness (PCS 10). In addition, the elderly may be anointed "if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present" (PCS 11). Children may be anointed "if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament" (PCS 12). For baptized Catholics who once had the use of reason and have subsequently lost it through unconsciousness, mental illness, or memory loss may be anointed if the person would have "asked for it when they were in control of their faculties" (PCS 14). (Pastoral Care of the Sick)
