Pastor's Ponderings

This coming Wednesday we begin the Holy Season of Lent. We mark ourselves with ashes as a reminder that we need to humble ourselves before God, turn away from our sinful ways and believe in the Good News of Jesus Christ. Prayer, fasting and the giving of alms are the traditional tools at our disposal to assist us in becoming better disciples. They are not magical actions, however. If one decides to fast from drinking coffee only to drink more tea, there probably is not going to be much spiritual growth. The same is true of collecting spare change to give to charity. Our sacrificial fasting and almsgiving need to open our eyes to some of the ways that things dominate our lives in ways that we are blocked from God and the things of God. So, for example, I choose not to go out to eat twice a week during Lent. I then reflect upon how many people do not have enough food to eat in our community and throughout the world. Perhaps, I will pray for them more intentionally, think about ways that I may waste food, or become involved in supporting programs that seek to feed those who are hungry year-round, and not simply for forty days. Lent is not an endurance test to withstand, but a retreat to open our hearts and minds. That is why it is vital to have a plan of action before Lent begins. Is my Lenten discipline significant and sustainable for the entire seasons of Lent? Will it address an area of my life that needs attention with regards to my relationship with God? That is, am I foregoing desserts just to lose some weight before summer, or freeing up some time to pray after dinner or support a local food pantry?

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday of days of fasting and abstinence. Those over 14 years old are to not eat meat. Those between 18 and 60 are to eat simply, with two smaller meals not exceeding the main meal of the day.

Carnivale and Mardi Gras celebrations are linked to Ash Wednesday, Lent, fast and abstinence. Can you tell us more about the connections between these events?



Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the forty days known as Lent. Every year, Christians highlight this penitential season as a time of self-examination, reformation of one's life, and continued development of a deeper spiritual life. The recommended practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving become the focus of Lenten activity and ritual. Each of these spiritual practices is aimed at personal discipline as well as continued concern for the other, especially the poor or alienated.

Forty days is a symbolic biblical period of time, during which personal transformation occurs and out of which people surface as more spiritual, ready to carry out God's mission. Relying on God's providence and care, no matter how difficult life becomes, is crucial to Lenten spirituality. Fasting was initially stricter, permitting only one simple meal a day without meat, fish, or other delicacies. Such things were not even allowed in the house.

In order to prepare for this in an age of no refrigeration, people gathered to consume whatever was not allowed during Lent. This led to parties or celebrations originally referred to as Carnivale, literally meaning "goodbye to meat," or Mardi Gras, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday." The eating and celebrating ended on the Tuesday just before Ash Wednesday. Today we focus more on moderation in all things, as well as a strong concern the poor. What are you doing for the poor this Lent?
