Please support our future priests and shepherds.

Who is a priest?



First, a priest one who offers sacrifice on behalf of the people to God. According to Archbishop Sample, in a recent released from the "voice of the Shepherd," he emphasized the importance of a priest's overall wellness in his ministerial life. He spoke about the unique ministry and identity of a priest as a bridge between God and the people. The priest, through his ministry, presents the reality of Calvary to the people at every mass. In essence, for a priest to serve in such a spiritual capacity, he must be a happy, holy, and joyful individual. A deeper relationship with Jesus Christ is essential for a priest to be effective in his ministry. While the validity of the Sacrament is not dependent on the worthiness of the priest, the priest's wellness is crucial to his ministry and vocation as he functions in the person of Christ (in Persona Christi). It is necessary for us to support those called to this vocation through our generosity, nurturing, growth, and effective function similar to the ministry of Jesus here on earth. It is our responsibility to aid and support our priests in their ministry for the souls.

Archbishop Sample stated clearly in the "Voice of the Shepherd" that the Church is founded on Christ, on the Apostolic foundation. Only a priest can bring us Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, hear confession and forgive sins on behalf of Christ in the Sacrament, and anoint the sick, among other duties. It costs up to about \$60,000 yearly to train and support a seminarian in the seminary. Although not worthy as human, a priest is chosen to function on behalf of Christ in the administration of the Sacrament. This explains why we need priests in all places of the world. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass represents Calvary at each Mass, and it is offered for the forgiveness of sins and the transformation of our lives.

We appreciate the support the faithful are demonstrating to encourage vocations to the Holy Priesthood and religious life, especially within our Archdiocese. We need many more priests, and we should encourage our youth to pray and discern if God is calling them. All of us have the responsibility to promote vocations, starting from families.

We shall have the Seminarians Appeal in our parish scheduled on the last weekend of September 2024.

Please help support the essential mission of our Lord Jesus Christ for our salvation. May God continue to bless and reward you abundantly. Amen. Thank you, again in Christ!
