ABSTINENCE: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on *FRIDAYS* of *Lent* and *GOOD FRIDAY*.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

Register Now for Catholic Men's Conference

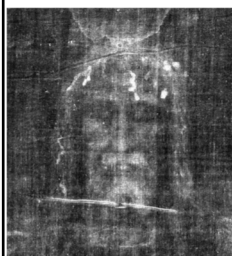
Saturday, March 21, 9:00 am – 3:30 pm (8:00 am registration) St. Pius Church, 1100 Woodside Rd., Redwood City
