Lessons I Learned In my Journey to Understand Seniors

When I began working with older adults, I was determined to help them figure out their future housing and care needs. I was going to be the best resource they ever had. But on my way to solving all their problems, I had the rude awakening that I didn't begin to understand them, let alone their "problems." I had answers, but they weren't necessarily the answers my clients needed.

I knew senior communities, assisted living and nursing homes. But I didn't understand the journey an elder travels, wasn't in touch with the emotions a senior experiences when their health begins to fail, when they stop driving, or when they're caring for their spouse and are faced with the reality that the ideal retirement they'd envisioned for the two of them would never be.

I also realized adult children are balancing their own family responsibilities along with caring for and worrying about their parents. That presented a whole new set of circumstances and another new puzzle I needed to find the pieces to. Once I had the pieces, I realized that each family had their own puzzle and they often looked very different from the next one. Some common threads for sure, but a lot of uniqueness.

Finally, I learned it's less about me giving them answers and more about guiding them to the right questions, allowing them to find "their own" answers. The more I listened "intently" the more I heard not only what they were saying, but what they weren't saying. That's where the gift in conversations lies.

I'm hopeful sharing my mistakes may keep you from making the same ones. Before you advise your loved ones, ask questions and listen intently to their answers. Try to put yourself in their place and imagine what they're experiencing and feeling. Picture a suitcase sitting next to them containing a lifetime of experiences that has molded them into the person you love, and understand that their suitcase contains different items than yours does.

Seniors recognize that your children have your best interests at heart, that they're trying to do what they believe is right by you. The more of your thoughts and concerns you share, the more they'll be empowered to move in the direction that will best serve you.
