

The number 40



Dear Friends,

We have entered the season of Lent which lasts 40 days- from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday.

I'm sure you've noticed that the number 40 keeps reoccurring over and over again in the bible. It's definitely one of our God's favourite numbers! But what does it mean?

The number 40 appears throughout the Old and New Testaments. It often represents a period of testing, trial or preparation. Here are just a few examples:

- It rained for 40 days and 40 nights during the Great Flood.
- The Israelites left Egypt and wandered in the desert wilderness for 40 years during which time they were tested and prepared for the challenges of entering the Promised Land.
- Elijah travelled for 40 days and 40 nights to Mount Horeb, the mountain of God.
- Moses spent 40 days and nights on Mount Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments from God.
- The spies spent 40 days exploring the land of Canaan.
- Goliath challenged the Israelites for 40 days before being defeated by David.
- Jonah prophesied to the city of Nineveh that it would be destroyed in 40 days.

- In the New Testament, Jesus fasted and prayed in the wilderness for 40 days and 40 nights during which time He was tested and tempted by the devil, before beginning His ministry.
- After Jesus' resurrection, He appeared to His disciples for 40 days before He ascended into heaven.

Overall, the number 40 is often associated with a time of transformation and spiritual growth, as well as a period of waiting, preparing and endurance.

The number 40 is a symbol of God's faithfulness and commitment to leading His people through difficult times and preparing them for the challenges that lie ahead.

It serves as a reminder to us that our God *is always with us* during these times and that through our endurance, we can become transformed and strengthened in our faith.

REFLECTIONS ON GOSPEL READING – Matthew 4:1-11




Both Luke and Matthew write a detailed account of Jesus being tempted in the desert right after the "high point" of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan. It is not accidental that each temptation occurs in a special place: the desert, the temple, and the mountain. The Bible tells us that each of these places pulsates with the possibility of encountering God there. One by one, Jesus needs to make clear choices as to what kind of Messiah God intends him to be. This passage also has both Satan and Jesus quoting Scripture, thereby illustrating that knowing Scripture is not enough – it must be properly interpreted and lived out.

- 1. What temptations in your life most challenge your faith commitment to Jesus?
- 2. Have you ever faced temptations in the process of clarifying your God-given mission?
- 3. Who or what helps you to be true to your faith and to Jesus Christ our saviour?




