

Sacrament of the Sick



Dear Friends,

As you know, I flew to Houston the week before Holy Week. I was away from that Monday to Friday.

The purpose of my visit was to see and say a final goodbye to a family member. My brother-in-law, Bai, was quite sick and not expected to live much longer. He was very weak, unable to move and confined to bed. My sister would make him some broth and feed it to him by the teaspoonful, a few sips at a time. The doctor suggested that it was time to gather the family together to say goodbye.

On the plane over, I prayed for my sister's husband. He lived the life of a very good man. He was someone you could count on for anything. He led the family in faith and ensured his children went to church and were brought up "right". Bai has always been a gentle and loving individual. He worked hard and provided well for his family and was generous and giving to anyone who needed help.

I was shocked when I arrived and saw him looking so very pale and not responsive. I knelt beside him and said a few prayers. Later, his family joined me in prayer as we formed a circle around his bed. I administered the Sacrament of the Sick and anointed him with the sacred oils before we all went to bed.

The next morning, he seemed to recognize who I was. I sat by his bed and reminisced about the past. He seemed to remember and was able to speak a few words.

In the days that followed, my brother-in-law gained back some strength- enough to help us move him from his bed to sit in his wheelchair.

By the end of my visit, my brother-in-law was able to move himself to the edge of the bed, unassisted. He went from being completely immobile to being able to move himself somewhat. His speech improved noticeably. He is now able to enjoy a meal with his family.

I have always strongly believed in God's healing through the Sacrament of the Sick. Over my thirty-six years as a priest, I have witnessed a few miracles happen to people who were close to death. Just as God knows the number of hairs on your head, He knows the time to take you home - regardless of what a doctor may tell you.

I love Bai and will miss him greatly when the Lord decides it's time to bring him Home. For now, Bai's quality of life has improved greatly, and he and his family can better appreciate the life he has left.




