

My Students Are Learning About Kindness



What a great idea!


Remember that smiling is not only good for you but also for those around you. So, keep smiling! (3)

RCIA Diocesan Workshop:



Note (1) — While total revenues are up \$44,646 or 18% compared to the same period in the preceding year, revenues are not keeping pace with expenses and the parish had incurred an operating loss of \$20,938 for the 9-month period ending September 30,2023. On a positive note, the net deficit represented an improvement of \$13,595 or 39% year over year, which is an encouraging trend.

Note (2) – The parish's 2023 Together in Action target has been set at \$36,194. Collections of \$18,167 represents 50% of target. **Parishioners are reminded that any TIA shortfalls must be covered by the parish.**

Note (3) – The parish's discretionary cash position, <u>is down</u>, \$22,438 from Jan 1, 2022 due to the <u>interim losses as recorded.</u>
