





Ask questions and, if possible, attend or view debates. Let us seek to elect a government that is committed to promoting and protecting the innate dignity of all, the common good, and a spirit of solidarity.

Human Dignity:

The inherent dignity of the human person comes from God. The right to have that dignity respected from conception until natural death is core to the Gospel. Human life is sacred, for each person is made in the image of God. CCC: 1701-1706; 1929-1933

Health Care:

Caring for all people and the common good requires that our political leaders ensure that health care is accessible to all, especially those most in need. Work and the Economy:

People before profits! Many Canadians are finding it difficult to find jobs that offer stability and a living wage. Precarious employment and low income can result in people having to live from paycheque to paycheque, underemployment, or unemployment. The economy must serve people. CCC: 2426-2436
