## ST VINCENT DE PAUL UPDATE--SIMCOE/WATERFORD/ DELHI

During the past month, in the Simcoe/Waterford/Delhi area, we gave a three day supply of groceries and \$2610.00 in food store gift cards, from our pantries, to 109 families, having a total of 260 adults and children. The Soup Kitchen opened on October 14th, and is providing nutritious take-out meals, three days per week to some of God's neediest children. Several other churches and organizations provided this service over the summer while our volunteers had a well-deserved rest.

The collection on the first Sunday of October was \$1366.00 from Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, \$519.00 from St. Bernard's and \$1463.00 from St Mary's. We also received donations from Immanuel Christian Reformed Church, Food Basics, Rotary Club of Norfolk Sunrise, the Thursday Night, Mixed Bowling League from Delhi German Home, Keith A Hutchinson Heating, St Joseph's School in Simcoe, St Francis Cabrini School in Delhi and Holy Trinity Catholic High School. The Thanksgiving Food Drive was an overwhelming success with many parishioners joining our Catholic Schools to assist the less fortunate in our area. ## Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time October 31, 2021

You shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength.

— Deuteronomy 6:5

#### LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year, we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O LORD, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.
