A Message

Dear Friends,



We welcome Fr Mickey Prieur to our Family of Parishes this Lenten Season for the Parish Mission. He will lead us on an inspirational journey of new hope for troubled times. We thank him for agreeing to share his wealth of knowledge with us under the guidance of the Holy Spirit for spiritual renewal and strength in our faith. It is a great opportunity for us to have a break from

our busy life in order to discover the door of hope that the Lord opens to us after Pandemic. Every one of us needs a moment like this to set aside other things so that we may focus on Christ. From the desk of Deacon Gerard:

In Sunday's gospel Jesus once again shows us the way of compassion and mercy. Not only to the accused woman the Scribes and Pharisees brought forward, but also to the accusers themselves. They had come to set what they thought was the ultimate trap to make Jesus lose his credibility. They thought they could force Jesus to act against the Law of Moses in his compassion and mercy for the woman. But Jesus changes the game! He turns the tables on them! He makes them realize they are as sinful as the woman they are accusing with one simple sentence. With that statement he moves the focus from the woman, from the trap and back on to the accusers, who can not deny that they too are guilty of sin.

We too can be quick to notice the sinfulness of others while minimizing our own guilt. Jesus reminds us to be compassionate and merciful toward our sisters and brothers and not to judge. Notice how tenderly Christ dealt with the woman, whose dignity and reputation had been trampled on. When you recognize your own guilt and stand exposed and shamed before God and others, remember that God is just as tender and compassionate toward you. Rejoice in Our Lord.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL UPDATE

SIMCOE/WATERFORD/ DELHI

During the past month, in the Simcoe/Waterford/Delhi area, we gave a three-day supply of groceries and \$2270.00 in food store gift cards, from our pantries to 114 families, having a total of 306 adults and children. The Soup Kitchen provided nutritious takeout meals, three days per week to some of God's neediest children. During the past month they served a hot, full course, take-out, meal to 1032 individuals, for an average of 86 people per day of operation. The collection on the first Sunday of March was \$669.00 from Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, \$1001.00 from St. Bernard's and \$2180.00 from St Mary's.

Our volunteers will be available after Mass on April 2nd & 3rd to accept your kind donations to assist the less fortunate in our area. Migrant Worker Ministry Norfolk Deanery

The growing and harvest season at the various greenhouses and farms in our Deanery is upon us, which means many men and women from Mexico, Guatemala, Colombia, Chile, Honduras and Venezuela have arrived to live, work and worship in our area. With the increased numbers at several new or expanded greenhouses in the Norfolk region, we will have many more 'parishioners' to accompany, serve and support from our community. We are in great need of recruiting volunteers to support with the different activities that Migrant Workers Ministry in the Norfolk region has provided since 2003 in Norfolk County. Prior to COVID-19 Pandemic, we were offering Spanish mass every Sunday, gatherings, dinners, community and cultural events. We supported those who were in need.

The Migrant Worker Ministry will greatly benefit from any kind of support that you would like to offer. We are looking for volunteers who can assist, for example, with the celebration of the Eucharist, connecting with workers, baking or fresh fruit donations, participating in the organization of cultural events, helping with transportation of workers.
