A Message

from the Pastor

Dear Friends:

From the Saturday, February 11 is the World Day of the Sick. The theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year's message is, "Take care of Him": Compassion as a Synodal Exercise of Healing. He began his message with the following: "Illness is part of our human condition. Yet if illness is experienced in isolation and

abandonment, unaccompanied by care and compassion, it can become inhumane". He went further, "the Samaritan calls the innkeeper to 'take care of him' (Lk 10:35). Jesus addresses the same call to each of us. He exhorts us to 'go and do likewise' (Lk10:37). On this day, the Sacrament of anointing of the Sick will be administered at the Mass at Our Lady Queen of Martyrs, at 10am. Healing is a gratuitous gift of God, let us be open to his grace.

The beginning of Lent is Wednesday February 22, when we shall celebrate Ash Wednesday to usher in the penitential season. It is the tradition of the church to burn the palms blessed on Palm Sunday of the previous year for the ashes on Ash Wednesday. Where it is not possible, ashes with specification (palm leaves or olive branches) can be purchased from approved stores for church supplies. The Palms from the Palm Sunday are used because, having blessed them, they become sacramentals which are not meant to be thrown around or put in the garbage but be burnt, buried, or kept in archive when no longer in use. The practice of burning the palms prevents them from being misused because the blessing upon the palms on Palm Sunday, sets them aside as religious articles for the praise of God and to arouse the piety of the faithful. We bear witness to our faith that Jesus is the victorious king over sin and death and has brought his peace to us when we leave the palms hanging on the walls, around the crucifix in our homes, on the family Altar, or among our religious article collections. We are to remember to bring them to church so that they may be burnt in preparation for Ash Wednesday. May the Lord bless and renew his spirit in us through Christ our Lord. Amen.


