Dear Friends:

Pastor Next weekend our Family of parishes will be celebrating with some of our children as they complete their sacrament of initiation, with confirmation. It is the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in a unique way in the life of our faith communities. We thank Fr Charles and Kathryn for coordinating with the schools to

make it happen in the absence of Parish Family and Youth Coordinator. We also thank the principals and the teachers of these students who did a great work in preparing them for the Sacrament. 
Room at the Table

BUILDING A CULTURE OF HOSPITALITY IN YOUR PARISH

As members of the Church, we strive to grow in our relationship with God and help others to do the same. Many people are not drawn to the Church without first feeling at home, like they belong. Hospitality makes the Church feel like home. It allows people to experience the Church in the most human way: imperfectly, with love.

The priest, deacon or pastoral minister cannot be present in every pew of every Mass to do this welcoming. It is up to the people sitting in the pew, the people who make up the Body of Christ, in His Church.

We are all called to engage in active hospitality. Here's an example to help illustrate what that means. Imagine you were invited to attend a great banquet, but you had to go alone:



Scenario Two

Someone notices you and they introduce themselves and invite you to join them at their table.

ACTIVE HOSPITALITY

Active hospitality in a church could look like:

- A kind and simple greeting at the door
- · People in the pews, not just greeters, noticing new people and saying hello
- Helping people find the washrooms or accessible entrances
- · Welcoming children and families

Tips for Engaging Conversations at Church

It is easy to come to church week after week and miss opportunities to build community with the people around you.

Community and belonging start with conversation. Here are some quick tips for meaningful conversations at church:

- Ask people their names. Even if you have been sitting near them for years, start with, "I should probably know this, but what is your name?"
- Engage in small talk to build trust, then get to more meaningful conversations. You can keep some "go-to" questions in mind like: Have you read any good books? What does your family do for fun?
- Continue the conversation. Try to touch base with someone each week, even if it's just talking as you file out of the church after Mass. Foster those connections and try to add new ones regularly.
- Pray for each other. As you're talking, ask the simple question, "How can I pray for you this week?"
