A Message from the Pastor Dear Friends:

The journey from Ash Wednesday is gradually winding up as we enter the most Holy Week. The week is holy because of the mystery of our salvation through the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. We are called to reflect on the sacrificial love of Christ for us, as we rejoice in the gratuitous gift of faith. Our faith in God made us beneficiaries in the promise of eternal life and co-heirs of the kingdom of the Father with Christ. This was the most crucial and agonizing week for Christ as he witnessed the betrayal of a trusted friend, the neglect and rejection by those who sang Hossana to son of David now shouting, crucify him! He surrendered himself to the passion and crucifixion in obedience to the will of the Father and his eventual resurrection from the dead.

We are encouraged to complete our Lenten journey by making efforts to join the celebrations beginning this weekend with Palm Sunday. Palms signify victory of Jesus, the King of Kings. The one who restores peace to his people having won the battle. On Holy Monday, we shall join the bishop at the Chrism Mass at St Peter's Basilica where there will be blessing of the three oils (oil of Catechumen, oil of the sick, and Chrism oil). At the Mass, the priests will renew their commitment to the service of the people of God and obedience to the authority of the bishop. On Holy Thursday, we shall celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper, to commemorate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and Priestly Ministry. On Good Friday, we shall have the Good Friday walk from La Salette to Delhi and celebrate the Passion of the Lord. On this day, Jesus shed his blood for our cleansing and died so that we may have life. On Holy Saturday, later in the evening we shall celebrate the Vigil of the Resurrection of the Lord. We shall find the details of these celebrations in the bulletin. Let us come together to celebrate our faith in the Lord as we bear witness to his abundant love for us. May the Lord renew the hope of salvation in us always. Amen.





ENCOUNTER WITH THE CROSS

The journey of Lent brings us to an encounter with the cross. During Lent, we have been led more deeply into questions at the heart of our faith: Who is God? And who are we, the Church? The Gospel of Matthew indicates that, in the crucifixion, God's true nature is most fully revealed in Jesus. In Jesus, God is the self-emptying One, who embraces humility and suffers rejection, as Paul tells the Philippians. God's power is redefined, present not in coercion and violence, but in Jesus' unbounded love. We the Church can learn who we are, the followers of the Crucified One, when we bear crosses that offer life and hope to the world. We more fully become the Church when we empty ourselves by sharing in others' sufferings, rejecting violence, and taking risks for justice and reconciliation. Like Jesus, we may reveal God's power as compassion and mercy.
