A Message from the Dear Friends,

This month brings back a lot of memories to many families when we remember our loved ones whom God called home. The close celebration of All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls (November 2) help Pastor us to navigate through our grief with the hope of salvation at the end of our earthly journey. We believe that we shall be together with our loved ones on the last day in the kingdom of God our Father. It is the

month that we also celebrate Remembrance Day (November 11) to honor the fallen heroes, the veterans and the serving officers who put their lives on the line for the protection of our nation. As Christians, we receive consolation from the scriptures that we don't grief for them like those who have no hope because our hope is in the power of resurrection that we receive in Christ. Just as Jesus was raised from the dead, the spirit of God who lives in us will also raise us from the dead. When our loved ones have completed their earthly journey in death, we have an obligation to take them to a place of rest for burial.

One of the corporal works of mercy is to bury the dead. Doing so, we help to return dust to dust, and it is a mark of honor and respect for the dead. It is an act that the dead can't do for themselves that we are been rewarded by God. God created us in his image and likeness; even at death the body must be treated with dignity. That is the reason for the cemetery as a place of rest where the dead are buried. When the dead are cremated, the ashes are put together completely into one Urn, for interment. It is not appropriate to divide the ashes or spread the ashes in water or the so-called places where the persons liked to go in their lifetime, or to put parts of the ashes in pendants. The most honorable and respect for the dead is to bury them. This gives honor to God in whose image we are created. This may also help to bring closure to sadness experienced, thereby enabling grief and mourning as part of the healing process. This can be intense, but we believe that death is not the end for us, because Jesus conquered death by his own death on the cross. In him we have the hope of eternal life where there is fullness of joy. May the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.





THE GIVING TREE




