+ My dear parishioners and friends:

I hope you are all settling well into the New Year, and I hope you are more successful than I have been at keeping my New Year's resolutions. Year after year, I find that I make the same resolutions (like not stealing hub caps or hotwiring cars) but then I fall back into my bad habits. Just kidding, of course, but I just wanted to make sure that you were paying attention.

As I mentioned in my homily this past weekend, Father Carlos, Father Vincent and I love being your priests, and we love that we are all here to serve you. We are so fortunate to have such a truly wonderful parish made up of such warm and loving people. In total, we had approximately 6,500 people attend our Christmas Masses. It was a fantastic mix of happy chaos and a beautiful prayerful experience all at the same time!

Take a look at the front cover of this bulletin. Our 160 Confirmation candidates were on retreat here last Saturday. I am so proud of the progress they are making in their spiritual lives under the direction of Alexis Fuentes, our youth minister, and her very talented team of adult volunteers and high school helpers.

I want to take this moment to thank you for your incredible generosity toward our Christmas collection, which is always the most critical one for any parish. Our numbers were up substantially from last year's collection. As of today, we have received more than \$225,000 with more money continuing to arrive from parishioners, who were not in town during Christmas. We will publish the final count in February.

I have been reflecting about our first six months together, and I have to say that I have been deeply touched by how all of you have made me and Father Vincent feel so at home. I think we are all bonding together well. Many of you have told me how pleased you are with some of the small changes we have been making. I have heard great things about our new bulletin format, and I think having the same homilist at all the Masses each weekend has resonated very positively with many of you as well.

Please be on the lookout for our second issue of *Bread to Roses*, which will be mailed to your homes sometime in mid-February. Deacon Andy will share some excellent information about the Permanent Diaconate, and we will share some photos and stories from Christmas as well!

Changing gears now, there are several other things that I would like to tell you about regarding the work I do as a sociologist. I have published two books thus far. The first book was a study of Catholic priests in America entitled Same Call, Different Men: The Evolution of the Priesthood since Vatican II. My other book is based on my doctoral dissertation which tracks a unique and often heart-wrenching dual-transition. From Celibate Catholic Priest to Married Protestant Minister: Shepherding in Greener Pastures is a combination of scientific study and individual case studies, which help to illuminate the difficult journey these men took. My third book, a first-time study of American Catholic Bishops, will be published this spring. Once it is out, I look forward to having a discussion group one evening. Perhaps in the meantime, if we can find space in our busy parish calendar, I will offer two adult education sessions, where I could summarize my first two books for you.

Finally, my other research work is conducted through the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University. I run their *Cultivating Unity* program for dioceses around the country. Currently, I am working with the dioceses in Salt Lake City and Springfield. Please keep me in your prayers as I help the bishops and priests in these dioceses in order to strengthen the Catholic Church at large.

May we all continue to strive for our best in our individual circumstances and also as a parish! God loves to see us using our talents to bring love and peace to each other every day!

RICA...IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic or is a Catholic but has yet to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include:

- Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church
- Baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church.
- Adult baptized Catholics who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so.




