

My Dear Friends in Christ:

I was so happy to share my homily with each of you this past weekend on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and to explain to you my childhood struggles with the number three.

I recall as a young man talking to a priest about the Trinity and the number three and the funny stories of growing up and being the youngest of three boys. I remember so distinctly the response of Father Joe. He said that, in our faith, there is great significance in the number three – especially in the Most Holy Trinity – in the triune nature of God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Three distinct persons who share one divine nature and have existed eternally in community with one another. This threefold relationship forms the basis of the community and relationship we are called to live as Christians. The Holy Trinity teaches us that beautiful relationships are founded on love — love that gazes upon the other with perfect affection and does not try to possess the other. It's a love that unifies the persons involved, proving to us that "God is love". When we contemplate this kind of love, we can bring that same love into our own relationships with our families, with our friends, with our loved ones, and with all those who we meet. This is what we are called to do as Christians. This is the power of number three in our faith and in our lives.

We understand further the power of number three in the Holy Trinity every time we make the sign of the cross. We touch our heads for God the Father who is our Creator. We touch our hearts for God the Son who is our Savior. We touch our shoulders for God the Holy Spirit who is our Advocate and Counselor.

As we continue together on this journey of faith, bringing the love of the Blessed Trinity into all our relationships, let us pray together: Glory be to the Father, who by His almighty power and love created me, making me in the image and likeness of God. Glory be to the Son, who by His Precious Blood delivered me from sin and death and opened for me the gates of heaven. Glory be to the Holy Spirit, who has sanctified me in the sacrament of Baptism, and continues to sanctify me by the graces I receive daily from His bounty. Glory be to the Three Persons of the Holy Trinity, now and forever. Amen.

Outreach Ministries at St. Elizabeth's: Our van ministry picks up bakery goods and produce from local stores and delivers them to Oasis & Eva's Kitchen, Fr. Frank English, and CUMAC. Parishioners are sent out "two by two", a driver and an assistant, to pick up food and bring it to Paterson. From Monday to Friday, 8:30-11:30 am start to finish, teams execute the Van Ministry. Weekly or monthly, men and women, retired or not, drivers and non-drivers, the schedule can be made to work for our volunteers.
