My friends at St. Elizabeth's,

I hope you have had a good and restful summer with your family and friends! I'm sure by now all of us are back to work and to school resuming our normal routines. I hope those summer memories will sustain you in the weeks and months ahead. For me, it was a grand summer traveling through Europe, attending the Diaconate Congress in New Orleans, and spending time with my family including my 20 month-old grand-son.



This weekend we celebrate National Grandparents Day, which is on Sunday, September 9. As grandparents, we can play a vital role in the lives of our grandchildren. For me, I remember spending time with my grandmothers who lived well into their 90's, visiting with them, and learning first-hand the history of our family. My parents and my wife's parents have played important roles in helping my children grow into mature, healthy adults contributing in their own way to our society. As a married permanent deacon living in the secular world, but also working and ministering in the name of our Church, I found comfort in the words of St. Paul who wrote, "Where sin increased, grace overflowed all the more." (Romans 5:20). For me, God's grace and love is alive and working in our world despite the crisis in our Church. I see it in our magnificent hospitals and educational institutions. I see it in the soup kitchens, the outreach to the poor, and in the children born into the world, who would not have been. I see God's grace alive and well here at St. Elizabeth's in all that you do in the name of Jesus Christ.

Where does this grace come from? Where do we find the courage to live our faith during unsettling times? It comes from Jesus Christ! Through our devotion to prayer, scripture, but most especially, through the Eucharist. As I mentioned in my homily last week, our identity and mission is ordered to and flows from the Eucharist, the source and summit of what it means to be a Catholic Christian. God's grace is poured into us whenever we feed on the body and blood of HIS Son giving us the courage to "go forth" to live our faith in the world despite the current situation.

Do not be afraid! Go forth to love God and neighbor.







These groups will provide a safe, confidential atmosphere where you can meet and spend some important time with others, who have also experienced loss. These groups are open to both men and women of all faiths. The only prerequisite for participation in these groups is that at least 3 months or more have passed since the time of loss. All our sessions are guided by trained, experienced leaders, who have also lost loved ones.
