Our Lord has given us a powerful word this past weekend. Jesus wants to heal our deafness to listen to Him and our muteness to speak in His name. 

Welcome back! I hope everyone had an awesome summer. I know we did in youth ministry! With BOLD, there's never a dull moment.

This year, St. Elizabeth teens were involved in three summer missions. The first trip in late June took us to upstate New York to one of the poorest counties in the United States. There, we met up with Catholic Heart Workcamp and connected with 300 other high school teens from across the United States. Each day, we received Jesus in the



Eucharist at Mass and then brought the love of Jesus into the streets of Plattsburgh. Students broke into small teams and went to work painting homes, weeding yards, fixing fences, and helping families with little means to maintain their own homes and communities. As if that wasn't rewarding enough, each work day was followed by an awesome retreat experience at night! Games, live music, inspirational speakers, prayer, and a "Jesus Rave" (complete with glow sticks) -- this camp had it all. Our teens served with loving compassion and a joyful spirit. They certainly made St. Elizabeth's proud.

In July, we took our mission back to our own home town with UServe! This time, it was our middle school students who had all the fun. Each day, our UServe campers visited a different service site, and learned about the needs of our own community. Whether it was stocking cans at the food pantry, playing bingo with the elderly, or practicing sign language with a special needs friend, our teens learned what it meant to be a missionary in your everyday life.

No BOLD summer would be complete without our yearly trip to Camp Sunshine in Casco, Maine. Camp Sunshine is a retreat center for families with children, who have life-threatening illnesses. Our teens served for a week in August as camp counselors to these families, caring for children, cleaning and preparing meals, and giving these heroic parents the respite they so desperately needed. Our team was an incredible gift to the Camp Sunshine families, but we were the ones who left feeling blessed.
