

My friends at St. Elizabeth's,

In my homily last week, I mentioned I had the opportunity to visit our CCD children in their classrooms. Not only was it a wonderful opportunity for me to see what they were learning, but an opportunity for me to meet their teachers. I must say, I was most impressed! We are so fortunate at St. Elizabeth's to have such faith-filled men and women who not only teach about God, but more importantly, they also share their faith with much love and enthusiasm with their students. Although parents are the first and most important teachers of the faith, we the community of St. Elizabeth's, support them and



our catechists by living out our own faith on a daily basis by striving to live holy lives. Our children are watching and learning from us!

Fortunately, we now have seven new saints, officially recognized into the Catholic Church last Sunday, who are models for us to follow. Our new saints are Pope Paul VI, Bishop Oscar Romero, and five others including two priests, two women religious, and a 19-year-old layman. In his homily recognizing the saints, Pope Francis noted that each "dedicated themselves with passionate love to following Jesus and caring for the weak and the poor." They all put the Gospel into action risking everything.

If you are like me and the rich man in our Gospel reading last week, you have probably followed the Ten Commandments pretty well. However, Jesus wants US to go beyond just following the commandments and to go deeper. He wants US to leave our comfort zones in order to follow Him more closely. Sometimes it may require us to do great things, like a former diaconate student of mine. As a Global Catholic Relief Service Fellow, he travels around the world assisting refugees in the poorest of poor countries.

Most of us are not called to do great things. However, each of us is called individually and by name to follow Jesus and to serve Him the best way we can in our own life circumstances. At St. Elizabeth's, we are so fortunate to have a wide variety of ministries with many different opportunities to serve God and to be the face of Christ for others. One of our vital ministries, in need of additional volunteers, is Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to bring Eucharist to the Christian Health Care Center after the 9am Mass on Sunday.

This ministry, in particular, has very deep significance for me and is close to my heart. It allows me to be the face of Christ to those who are weak and poor in both mind and body. The residents I visit are grateful for the opportunity to feed on the body of Christ. However, I often feel when I leave their rooms that I have seen the face of Christ in them, and they have ministered to me. I think all those involved in this ministry would agree with me that it is a grace-filled honor and privilege to minister at Christian Heal Care Center. 


