My Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ:

Happy Fourth Week of Lent!

We have received so much positive feedback on the "teaching" homilies regarding the Mass. I am so happy that you are enjoying these homilies. There are so many beautiful things that happen in the Mass that we may not know. Once we fully appreciate and understand the miracle that happens on the altar each time we are together, it is truly magnificent!



This is such an exciting time at the parish. We have our 13 RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) candidates and catechumens at the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday for a time

of prayer and reflection called the Scrutinies. These 13 brothers and sisters will receive the Sacraments of Initiation during the Easter Season. The Scrutinies are described as follows: "The Scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated on Sundays, are rites of self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the Scrutinies are celebrated to protect the elect against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all." We pray for these men and women as they continue their journey to becoming Catholic.

We also welcome 48 couples to our parish who are participating in the Pre-Cana program offered here at Saint Elizabeth's. These couples will also join us at the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday. We pray for these couples as they approach the Sacrament of Matrimony, and we wish them all well in their married life together.

Father Stephen will present the Parish Lenten Mission on the Shroud of Turin on Monday, April 1st and Tuesday, April 2nd at 7:30 p.m. in the Church. It is sure to be a wonderful and informative mission describing one of the greatest religious artifacts of all time.

Finally, we invite all of you to a Lenten Penance Service on Saturday, April 6, 2019 at 12:30 p.m. at the Church of the Nativity, 315 Prospect Street in Midland Park. All three priests from Saint Elizabeth's will be present as well as priests from other parishes in the area to hear confessions. It is a good opportunity for you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter.

Let us continue to pray for each other during this Lenten Season. May the peace of Christ be with all of us as we draw closer to Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday.



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS


1. The days of both Fast & Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection.

The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted and (2) smaller meals which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.

Those between the ages of 18-59 are obliged to fast. On a day of **Abstinence**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast & Abstinence "substantially" or as whole is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 10, 2019 to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.

*Canon 920. §1 All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year..
