This past Sunday, we celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi. This is such a beautiful day during our liturgical year when we experience this very tangible connection with Jesus. The Eucharist is His coming into our physical beings to be with us and to nurture our souls. We are blessed to have our own small chapel here in the rectory where the three of us can visit Jesus at any time. Whenever I leave the rectory or come home, I always make a brief visit to see my “Boss” and to say a prayer for the people I will meet at my next encounter. I always ask for His guidance for whatever ministry I am about to engage in. It’s part of my ongoing dialogue with Him throughout the day, and it makes me feel very connected to Him.



I find that it is a beautiful and comforting experience having Jesus involved in my everyday life. I share this with you because there are two wonderful ways that you can continue to incorporate Him into your everyday activities as well. Anytime, you are near a church, if you feel so inclined, just stop in for a visit. You would be surprised how just a few minutes of quiet prayer can be so uplifting and can offer so much hope. The other way is to join our group of parishioners who set aside time once a month to adore Jesus in the Eucharist. They sign up for one-hour turns to spend quality time with Jesus on the second Friday of every month starting at 7 PM and concluding just prior to the 9 AM Mass on Saturday. Pat Khanjian, who also runs our Vacation Bible Camp, which took place this week, is our primary contact for signing up for Eucharistic Adoration. Please reach out to her if you are interested in this special prayerful ministry.

As I mentioned in my homily last weekend, the recent gathering of all our archdiocesan priests kneeling together to focus on Jesus in the Eucharist was powerful. He is working in so many wonderful ways in all of us. We are truly blessed to have so many people attend Mass here every weekend. Speaking of Mass, I could use a little help from some of our younger parishioners. We are in need of more Altar Servers, particularly in the summer. I would be delighted to have any of our young boys and girls, who would like to experience the joy of serving God in this way, to join us. You have only to let Father Carlos know, and he will make sure we get you signed up! Thank you very much for considering this important ministry.

Finally, as we embark on our last week of filming *Trinity’s Triumph*, I want to thank you for all your prayers for the success of this amazing project and to all those who have taken the time from their busy schedules to serve as *extras*. This has been a fantastic opportunity to share the priesthood with others from a slightly different vantage point. *Trinity’s Triumph* will bring a few tears, a few very good laughs, but most importantly, it will show how Jesus is working in very unexpected ways in our lives every day!

R.C.I.A. -Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a year-long ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non-Christians), Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.

IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic? Are you Catholic but have not yet received all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include:

- Non-baptized adults, who wish to enter the Catholic Church
- Baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian), who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church
- Adult baptized Catholics, who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so.

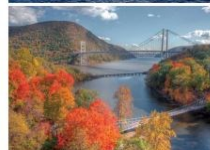
