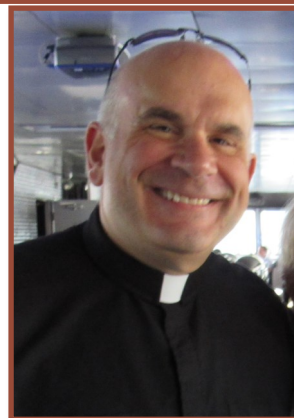
Can you find

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The apostle Paul tells us: "... faith is the substance of things hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen." (Heb. 11:1.) Faith and belief have been used synonymously, and it is sometimes difficult for us to differentiate between the two. There is a difference.

As I explained in my homily last weekend, the apostles believed in Jesus. But Jesus wanted not only belief, he wanted faith – because faith in Him was needed to do the things that Jesus expected of them, like forgive, heal, love their enemies, and trust in the promises of eternal life. Jesus also wants you and me to not only believe, but to have faith as well.



Faith is knowing that we are in God's hands always – both in times when life is good and in times when life stinks. It's a relationship of trust and love. It means opening ourselves to receive another's life and giving our life to another in all things. This other is Jesus Christ. This faith relationship with Our Lord is determinative of who we are and how we live our lives every single day – even in the messiness of life. In the ups and downs of life, He is the constant. Our faith in Him is what energizes us to keep going!

Faith is practiced day after day in the ordinary everyday circumstances of our lives. Some days when the pain and heaviness of life seem more than we can carry, it is by faith, by our relationship with Jesus Christ, that we get up each morning and face the realities of life.

Each of you all inspire me as a person and as a Priest. Each of you make me want to do better and to be better because of who you are and the love that you have shown me. Thank you.

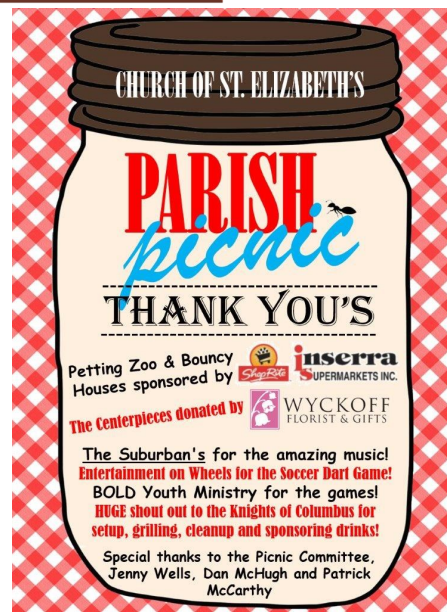

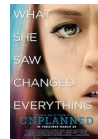
