Dear brother and sisters,

It was great to be with you last weekend and to have the opportunity to preach the homily. After Mass, I was able to take more time to reflect on the topic of hypocrisy and what you and I can do better as Christians leading others back to Christ. We know that hypocrisy in the Church and among each of us turns people away. We should also know that humility is the best cure for overcoming hypocrisy.

Only when we open our hearts to Jesus, the divine physician, and allow Him to search out those evil things that truly defile us - unchastity, greed, adultery, envy - can we keep close to Him. Attending Mass regularly, developing a deep prayer life, performing Works of Mercy, and taking part in particular devotions are all wonderful things, but if we don't have humility, we may begin to look down on others as the Pharisees and scribes did.

As society begins to open back up and as the new school year gets underway, we are called to redouble our efforts to bring our separated brothers and sisters back home to our faith. Let us lead this effort with a deep humility and a true desire to share the Good News of the Gospel through our words and deeds. Let us invite our friends, family and coworkers to share in the life of this wonderful parish community!

Although I know it's farther down the road, I hope you will join me in preparing a little differently for our Christmas liturgies in December. How can we welcome our brothers and sisters, whom we miss all year, in a more special way? How can we help them have a special experience with the Church and the source and summit of Christian life, the Eucharist? And would that experience be enough to have them rejoin us and the Lord?

Although I am a little sad to see summer end, I am very excited to see our community come back together again. Have a safe holiday weekend!!
